Planning is underway for New K-8 School HH

Emily Harrison, Principal of the K-8 school in Durbin Crossing recently met with parents at Hickory Creek to discuss her plans for the new school. After school HH opens in August, Hickory Creek will shrink by more than one-third of its present enrollment to approximately 525 students. The opening of the new school is expected to affect between 11 and 16 HCE teachers. Across the county, nine elementary, middle and high schools are affected by the opening of the two new K-8 schools in St. Johns County. Next month, Mrs. Harrison and Mr. Wayne King, Principal of the K-8 school in Nocatee will begin interviewing teachers for their schools and it is my hope that many of Hickory's wonderful teachers will find places in the district's newest schools. We enjoy the opportunity to work with our Durbin Creek students and their supportive families.

Anti-Bullying Initiative

This year I have been focusing on helping students understand the power of their words and actions. I have met with each class and discussed what bullying is and what to do if they are a target of bullying or if they see it occur. I have been reading Confessions of a Former Bully by Trudy Ludwig on the morning show. It is a wonderful book that brings us into the mind and heart of a girl who bullies and shows us that change is possible. It provides effective tools for girls and boys in every social role, whether they are instigators, targets or bystanders.

Students will be recognized on the morning show if they are "caught" having the courage to take a stand against bullying. Please encourage your child to include someone being left out or letting an adult know when they see bullying.

I have also created an Anti-Bullying Student Task Force that will be meeting with me during lunch to brainstorm and implement anti-bullying ideas school wide. One idea is for task force students to share their heartfelt bullying experiences with other students at HCE so they can see, first hand, how hurtful bullying can be! My goal is to make Hickory Creek a safe and kind school for all children!

Helping Kids Deal with Bullying

If your child tells you about being bullied, listen calmly and offer comfort and support. Kids are often reluctant to tell adults about bullying because they feel embarrassed and ashamed that it's happening, or worry that their parents will be disappointed, upset, angry, or reactive.

Sometimes kids feel like it's their own fault, that if they looked or acted differently it wouldn't be happening. Sometimes they're scared that if the bully finds out that they told, it will get worse. Others are worried that their parents won't believe them or do anything about it. Or kids worry that their parents will urge them to fight back when they're scared to.

Praise your child for doing the right thing by talking to you about it. Remind your child that he or she isn't alone — a lot of people get bullied at some point. Emphasize that it's the bully who is behaving badly — not your child. Reassure your child that you will figure out what to do about it together.

Let someone at school (the principal, school nurse, or a counselor or teacher) know about the situation. They are often in a position to monitor and take steps to prevent further problems.

Because the term "bullying" might be used to describe such a wide range of situations, there's no one-size-fits all approach. What is advisable in one situation may not be appropriate in another. St. Johns County School District Media Release January 27, 2014

The St. Johns County School District (SJCSD) will hold pre-registration for children entering kindergarten and students new to St. Johns County and/or public schools on Wednesday, February 5 from 9 a.m.-1 p.m.; Wednesday, March 12 from 1-5 p.m.; Thursday, April 17 from 9 a.m.-1 p.m.; and Tuesday, May 6 from 1-5 p.m.

To be eligible for public kindergarten in St. Johns County, children must be 5 years old on or before September 1 and must reside in St. Johns County. To register for first grade, children must be 6 years old on or before September 1 and have documentation of successful completion of kindergarten.

Parents must register children at the school where they are zoned for the 2014-2015 school year. Three proofs of residency must be provided such as a current mortgage statement, lease or rent agreement and two other forms of residency documentation such as a current electric bill, car registration and/or driver's license. Additional information on residency and guardianship as well as a link to the Attendance Zone Locator can be found on the website at www.stjohns.k12.fl.us under "Featured Links."

Florida law requires any student entering a Florida school for the first time to show proof of required immunizations documented on the HRS Form 680. Proof of a physical examination that has been obtained within one year prior to enrollment in school is also required. Physical examinations can be performed by either a private physician or by the county health department.

Voluntary Pre-kindergarten (VPK) pre-registration will also take place at select schools on the above dates and times. Children applying for the VPK program must be 4 years old on or before September 1. The SJCSD offers full day VPK at the following locations: The Webster School, John A. Crookshank, Cunningham Creek, Ketterlinus, Otis Mason, Mill Creek, Ocean Palms, Osceola, PVPV/Rawlings, South Woods, Timberlin Creek and Wards Creek elementary schools. For additional information on the SJCSD VPK program, please contact Early Childhood Services at 547-4899.

Students can be registered during the spring and summer for the 2014-2015 school year, however; parents are encouraged to register during the designated dates above so that schools can adequately prepare for the new school year. Additional information regarding registration and school attendance zones may be obtained from the Student Services Office at 547-7598.
