There are 4 working days until the optional *FACTS* and *Personnel Approval* transmissions are due on Friday, January 22<sup>nd</sup>. You may transmit as many times as necessary until the end of business on Friday, January 22<sup>nd</sup>. If you are a member of a SuperSite, your SuperSite may have designated an earlier due date.

In order for *iepoint* > to have the most up to date information, be sure to *Refresh Common Data* on a daily basis when preparing for a transmission.
