Preparing for Next Year: STEM Blended Learning Academy & Humanities Learning Academy

STEM Blended Learning Academy

STEM is the acronym for Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics. The Henry County Middle School STEM Blended Learning Academy will offer students the opportunity to focus on science, technology, engineering and mathematics course content and practices that are integrated within all core subject areas. The focus will also be Technology Enabled Learning, which will allow for a combination of Online and Face-to-Face instruction, and Service-Based Project Learning.

The STEM team will:

- Consist of students with a high degree of interest in the STEM discipline areas
- Combine Online and Face-to-Face instruction
- Integrate Service-Based Project Learning
- Provide inquiry-based instruction with a focus on problem-solving, decision making, discovery, and a high degree of interactive involvement
- Promote an interdisciplinary teaching approach
- Expect students to work both independently and in group settings
- Include consistent application of STEM Standards of Practice across the curriculum

STEM Standards of Practice

- 1. Learn and apply rigorous science, technology, engineering, and mathematics content.
- 2. Integrate science, technology, engineering and mathematics content.
- 3. Interpret and communicate information from science, technology, engineering, and mathematics.
- 4. Engage in inquiry and logical reasoning.
- 5. Collaborate as a STEM Team.


The Humanities team will:

Middle School Transition

Middle school can be a whirlwind of social, emotional, and physical changes that can overwhelm your child. If not prepared with the skills needed to cope with these changes, a student's academic achievement, future aspirations, and feelings of self-worth can suffer. Here are a few tips on how you can help prepare your child for a successful middle school transition:

- » Take a tour of the school with your child and help them map out a route to each class.
- » Meet your child's teacher and other school staff and ask them what your child can expect in their first few weeks of school.
- » Ask for the upcoming school calendar and encourage your child to make note of school events and activities that might interest them.

High School Transition

It is very common for students to feel a great sense of apprehension upon transitioning from middle school to high school. During this time, there is a misconception that parents should be less involved than they were in elementary or middle school. However, your involvement is crucial in order for your new high school student to be off to a good start. Here are a few ways that you can do your part in supporting your child's successful transition into high school:

- » Help them develop responsibility by teaching them the importance of setting goals and holding themselves accountable.
- » Be aware of what assessments and classes your child will be expected to take and help them stay on track.
- » Nurture their independence by encouraging them to venture outside of their comfort zone by exploring extracurricular activities.




Parent/ Student Conferences


