The Henry County Office of English/Language Arts is proud to provide the initial draft of our district text exemplar reading list for continued stakeholder input and revisions.

Our text exemplar list is not a comprehensive book list. It does not mandate a particular text for a particular grade nor does it prohibit a particular text from a particular grade. It is simply a recommendation from district ELA leadership for authentic standards driven instructional selections.

Our Text Exemplar Philosophy

We strongly believe that effective standards based ELA instruction require complex text. These texts allow students to interact with words, images, and ideas in ways that develop their abilities in reading, listening, viewing, thinking, speaking, writing, and using media and technology.

Because these text and like instructional materials are a primary resource for English language arts teachers, they must be selected wisely.

As provided by our Department of Education's guidelines for text exemplar lists, some key considerations in our district include:

- Reading volume matters for adolescents; encourage students to read widely and to choose books and other reading materials related to their interests.
- Challenging books and other reading materials can be accessible with teacher support (e.g., by building background knowledge, previewing vocabulary, and providing reading guides).
- Identify texts in sets that work together to prepare students to read more challenging texts.
- Identify books and other reading materials that represent a variety of interests and Lexile levels.
- Exercise caution concerning the social appropriateness of fiction or non-fiction written above grade level.
- Ensure that the books and other reading materials selected represent a variety of cultures and viewpoints.

Our Text Exemplar Selection Process

Department chairpersons gathered several times to recommend reading selections and solicit feedback from department members throughout the 2013-2014 school year.

Our compiled first draft was distributed for review and commentary on March 7. The deadline for additions and deletions with appropriate rationales was March 28.

The second draft was distributed for review and commentary on April 2. Final approval by district chairpersons occurred during the summer of 2014.


