Henry Ossawa Tanner



- Born 1859 in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania
- Oldest of nine children
- Father was a minister in the African Methodist Episcopal Church
- Mother was a former enslaved person who escaped on the Underground Railroad
- Educated at the Pennsylvania
 Academy of Fine Arts in Philadelphia
- Professor at Clark College (Now Clark Atlanta University)

Tanner in France



- 1891 Tanner moved to France to further his art
- Found Paris to be less restrictive for people of color
 - 1899 married white American singer, Jessie Olssen
- 1903 birth of their only child, Jesse
- Died in Paris on May 25th, 1937
