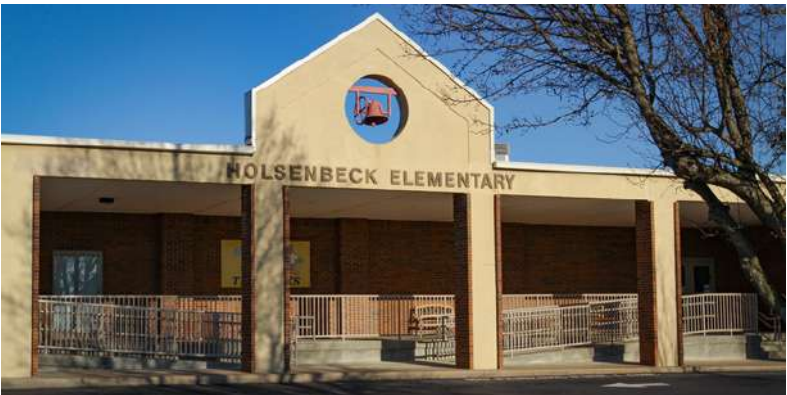

### What is Title I?

Our school is identified as a Title I school as part of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act of 1965 (ESEA). Title I is designed to support State and local school reform efforts tied to challenging state academic standards to reinforce and enhance efforts to improve teaching and learning for students. Title I programs must be based on effective means of improving student achievement and include strategies to support parental involvement. All Title I schools must work collaboratively with all parents to develop a written family engagement plan / policy. To ensure this is achieved, we invite all families to an evening of learning and sharing about our Title I program, our school family engagement policy, schoolwide plan, and the school-family compacts. Invitations will be emailed and posted in the school newsletter, social media, and school website.

### School Family Engagement Plan

#### What is it?

The school family engagement plan for shared student achievement describes how our school will provide opportunities to improve family engagement and support student learning. Our school values contributions and involvement in establishing an equal partnership for the common goal of improving student achievement. This plan describes the different ways that our school will support family engagement and how families can help plan and participate in activities and events to promote student learning at school and at home.

#### How is it revised?

Every year our school reviews all the input and feedback provided by families to revise this plan in an effort to meet our community's needs and recommendations. Our school gathers feedback and input through several events and activities (i.e. Spring Planning Meeting, Comprehensive Needs Assessment Survey, during family engagement events, in-person and online feedback forms, etc.).

#### Who is it for?

All students participating in the Title I, Part A program, and their families are encouraged and invited to fully participate in the opportunities described in this plan. Our school will provide full opportunities for the participation of families with limited English, families with disabilities and families of migratory children.

#### Where is it available?

At the beginning of the year, the plan is given to all students. The plan will also be posted on the school website. Families can also retrieve a copy of this plan in the Family Resource Center.

## Reservation of funds

Beginning with the 2014-2015 school year, our school agreed to allow the district to use the 1% set aside for family engagement to fund a district-wide Family Engagement Specialist.

## Technical Assistance

The district will provide clear guidance and communication to assist our school in developing adequate family engagement plans, activities and events that address the recommendations made by families during the comprehensive needs assessment survey as well as other input provided throughout the school year.

## How we are promoting and supporting Family Engagement?

Our school will take the following measures to promote and support families as an important foundation of the school in order to strengthen the school and reach our schools goals. We will:

- Ensure that all information related to school and family programs, meetings, and other activities is published in both English and Spanish, posted on the school website, and included in the monthly school newsletter for all families.
- Provide trainings four times per year for staff during their planning/professional development periods on strategies to improve communication with families and ideas to increase family engagement. Staff will also share best practices during regularly scheduled faculty meetings.
- Partner with early childhood programs, middle and high schools, college and career ready resources or organizations, parent resource centers, or other programs (as applicable) to help prepare families and their children for successful school transitioning.
- Communicate with all families and the community on a regular basis regarding school wide events and activities, through phone messages, social media, and flyers.
- Share information in English and Spanish on the school website and during school events for families to understand the school's academic standards and assessments as well as the ways families can monitor their child's progress and work with educators.
- Work with our families to develop relevant trainings and helpful presentations to educate our staff on the importance of family engagement.
- Collect feedback from families at all events, post feedback form on the school website in order to respond to families' request for additional support for family engagement activities/events. Provide alternate meeting times or digital copies of meeting materials upon request.

## Goals for Student Achievement

### District Academic & Student Success Goals

1. Implement a K-12 vertically and horizontally aligned curriculum that prepares students for academic and career success.
2. Implement system and school improvement processes that result in improved instructional practice and high levels of student academic achievement.
3. Ensure all students have access to a safe and positive learning environment resulting in healthy social development, increased academic outcomes, and improved graduation rates.

### School Goals

Holsenbeck Elementary staff have studied our performance data to determine the most important areas of continuous improvement for our school:

- Increase the number of students who are reading our grade level as measured by TRC.
  - At least 80% of our kindergarten-fifth grade students will make at least one year's worth of reading growth.
- We will increase student proficiency in math as measured by the MAP assessment.
  - 60% of students (Kindergarten-5th grade) will achieve conditional growth percentile of 50% or higher in Math from Fall to Spring.
- We will increase the percentage of students who indicate that they always/often like school by 10%.
- We will increase the percentage of students who indicate that good behavior is noticed at our school by 12%.

## Family Engagement

The compacts will be reviewed and updated annually based on feedback from families, students and teachers during the Annual Needs Assessment event. The school-family compact are to be kept at home with the family as a reminder of their commitment.

- Practice reading, writing skills, and basic math facts with my family.
- Complete activities sent home by my teacher.
- Use online resources at home or the public library to practice reading and math skills.
- Try my best at school every day.
