•Formative grades are used for things that are helping you to FORM your knowledge—i.e., homework, most quizzes, etc.

•Formative assignments shouldn't be blown off! They can bring your average down a letter grade or more. Twenty five percent of your grade makes a difference!

•Formative assignments are **PRACTICE** for your summative assessment coming up.



We have seen that time and time again there is a correlation between a student's quiz grade for a particular unit and their test grade for that unit.

✓Why do you think this is the case?

✓ What could a student do if they get a 70 on a quiz to make sure they don't get a 70 on the test? How can they use their quiz to inform their study plan?

✓ What about homework? If a student completes 7/10 of their homework assignments for a unit, what do you predict their test grade will be?

Homework Homework—Why Do It?



•Think of homework as your opportunity to practice what will be on the test

•Sometimes test questions look VERY similar to homework and study packet questions—what better way to prep!

•Homework shows you what you do and don't know—if you can't figure out a homework problem, you have time to get help Activity—Prove it to yourself! Let's practice our graphing skills



•Take out your grade report.

•Make a Graph:

•Make a timeline as the x axis starting with August, then September, then October

- •Make a number line for the y axis starting with 30, then 40, and go all the way to 100
- •Graph your formative grades using dots & connect with a straight line.

•Graph your summative grades using dots & connect with a dotted line.

Pair and Share Discuss your results...



Turn to the person sitting to your left. Share the relationship you saw between the grades—you don't have to share actual grades. ©

What does this experiment tell you?

Activity—This is really interesting! Attendance and it's role in the big picture

•Take out your attendance report.

•Go back to your graph

- •Change the numbers on the y axis to 1-7
- •Graph your absences using the number of absences as they correspond to the months

•Use an * to graph your absences and connect them with a dashed line ----

•Now, take a look at the big picture—do you see a relationship between your absences and your grades?

Attendance—Missing School= Missing Out! It's a lot easier to keep up than it is to catch up!



 \checkmark 9th grade attendance rates are one of the best predictors of whether or not a student will graduate on time

✓The U.S. Department of Education maintains that for every missed day of school, it takes a student TWO days to catch up

✓Come to school regularly so you don't miss instruction, class discussions, and helpful examples

✓ Make up work can get very overwhelming—IF you do miss school, check ANGEL to see what was covered that day, make a plan with each teacher to find out when you can take missed quizzes or tests, and turn in any missing work
