

Units of Study

Honors Physical Science is an advanced course offered to 8th grade students. Successful completion of this course results in one Carnegie unit of credit at the high school level. Students may choose to accept or waive this credit at the conclusion of the course. At BASA, we implement the <u>Physical Science Georgia Standards of Excellence</u> which are designed as a survey of the core ideas in the physical sciences. The physical science standards include abstract concepts such as the conceptualization of the structure of atoms and the role they play in determining the properties of materials, motion and forces, the conservation of energy and matter, wave behavior, electricity, and the relationship between electricity and magnetism.
