Course Description:

Course Requirements:

Students will

- All homework is expected the following day unless otherwise stated by Mrs. West.
- Projects will be given in advance so that time management can be used to complete the project.

- Enter the classroom quietly, sharpen pencil as needed, be seated, and be prepared for class to begin. All students will complete a question of the day activity.
