HONORS U.S. HISTORY:

The curriculum for Honors U.S History is the same as the regular education course with additions on the length and frequency of assessment. Nightly homework is part of this course. Students will be asked to read and compare sources as homework to enrich the time spent in class. The use of Document Based and Free Response questions will shape assessment along with the course load of the regular curriculum.

COURSE DESCRIPTION:

United States History is diverse. Millions of people have contributed to the American drama that continues to unfold as our history. This year we will research and analyze the past to try and understand the miraculous development of our country through events, individuals and politics. The American past is the heritage we share. History is a course that teaches us about the past, but also gives us lessons about our future. Historians try to answer questions about the past so certain events will not be repeated or to give consideration about what will be the best kind of decision for the future. In this manner, history becomes not just a study of social behaviors, but a science to be considered to insure events in the future.

TEXTBOOK:
