- 3. **oasis** an area in a desert where plants can grow. The plants are fed by water from a spring or well.
- 4. **interposition** the act or state of putting (oneself) in a position between opposing parties, often as mediator.
- 5. nullification the act or state of causing or declaring to have no legal force or effect;
- 6. exalted honored or glorified
- 7. hew to shape by cutting or hacking.
- 8. **despair** the complete lack of hope.
- 9. discord lack of agreement or harmony among people or things; conflict.
- 10. **prodigious** inspiring wonder and admiration; marvelous.
- 11. curvaceous having obvious curves
- 12. hamlet a small village or settlement.
- 13. **outlier** something that is situated from or classified differently from a main or related body; a statistical observation that is markedly different in value from the others of the sample
- 14. compatriots a fellow citizen.
- 15. ethos the source's credibility, the speaker's/author's authority
- 16. **pathos** persuading by appealing to the reader's emotions.
- 17. **logos** the logic used to support a claim (induction and deduction); can also be the <u>facts</u> and <u>statistics</u> used to help support the argument.
- 18. **egalitarian** of, pertaining to, based on, or characterized by belief in the principle of equal rights for everyone.
- 19. **meritocracy** a system in which people attain power, influence, and wealth because of their intellectual abilities rather than because of their class status or family lineage.
- 20. Anaphora-repetition of a phrase in the beginning of several sentences
- 21. **Allusion**-a reference to someone or something from literature, religion, history, or some other field or branch of culture
- 22. Rhetoric-the art of using language effectively
