Independent Reading Project: One-Pager

You are going to create a "one-pager" in which you draw/represent major ideas from your independent reading book. The One-Pager should include the following:

- > the **title** of the story
- > the **author** of the story
- ➤ three important **quotes** from the story (with page numbers)
- ➤ a personal response to the story (at least four sentences) You may want to include here what you learned from reading the story and whether or not you would recommend it to someone else.
- ➤ at least **three pictures** of major people/things/events from the story
- > at least one symbol from the story and what it represents
- ➤ at least **three** other items/pictures that represent <u>literary</u> <u>elements</u> from the story (foreshadowing/symbolism/irony/figurative language, etc.)

**On the back of the one pager, you should write a <u>detailed paragraph</u> explaining the <u>theme</u> of the novel. You should include at least <u>three</u> examples from the novel (with page numbers) to support your theme.

You can use markers, colored pencils, and any other items to make your one-pager stand out from the crowd. You can also make a computer generated one; this could be shared with me instead of printing out a hard copy.
