WHAT IS AN INTERJECTION?

- An interjection is a word or words that show feeling or emotion.
- If the interjection shows strong feeling, it stands alone and is followed by an exclamation point.
 - **Wow!** The boat is big! **Good grief!** The sails are huge!
- If the interjection shows mild feeling, it begins the sentence and is followed by a comma.
 - **Ah,** the breeze is nice. **Well,** let's go sailing!
