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## **WILSON'S WAR EAGLE UPDATE**

Happy New Year, War Eagle Nation.

This month's communication contains a note for seniors followed by an abundance of information surrounding registration. Please read and watch for all communication containing directions and deadlines as we progress through the next several weeks. \*Please click on the underlined text in this newsletter for links to specific information, forms, and more.\*

#### Seniors and families:

The second semester is full of emotions for you and your families. Enjoy every "last" event you are involved with BUT you still have to pass classes to graduate. A total number of credits and specific courses are "HAVE TOs" according to the state of Georgia to receive a diploma. Universities, future employers, and military recruiters view your second-semester performance as an indication of your dedication and commitment to the task at hand. Attendance matters. There is a hard deadline for Q3 missing work - March 13 - so don't wait too long to get and remain caught up. If you are missing any midterm exams, it is imperative you get them caught up this week as midyear reports are sent to colleges in the next few weeks and the grade change process takes a bit of time. You want your grades to be accurately reflected when they are sent. Please keep an eye out for the senior page sharing all information relative to senior activities, graduation (see Ms. Duff immediately if you haven't yet paid dues and ordered a cap and gown), and end-of-year processes! Finish strong Class of 2023! Raise the bar and be an example for the underclass students. This is an exciting time! Enjoy every moment!

#### Rising 9th-12th Graders:

First, I want to be frank and share that students should create schedules that reflect graduation needs, their passions when choosing electives, and BALANCE. The goal for all students is to be prepared learners when they leave high school and move on to the next phase of their lives. Time for family, friends, and outside-of-school interests are vital to healthy minds. Several thoughts for your consideration and discussion as a family:

- There is more than one route to a destination. No one route is perfect. All routes will have roadblocks which are not the end of the world. All students headed for a similar destination will not get there the same way and therein lies the beauty of choice.
- There are no magic formulas for admission to a university, selection for service, or employment. Beyond course work, true passion for volunteering (not the volume of clubs and organizations on a resume), experiences and learning outside of school related to passions and interests, and soft skills really do matter. Authenticity is the key. Think substance over quantity.
- Burnout in high school does not make for healthy post-secondary success.
- Struggle is not a bad word. Learning from the struggle with content and organization skills emerging is most valuable when family support is there to guide. Eventually, we all struggle with something better now than when you are not around to lend support and guide response.
- Student engagement in their educational path is critical and directly proportional to student engagement in coursework. Have them choose classes with you by their side!
- While you absolutely know your child the best of anyone, teachers who make recommendations know your child in the classroom setting and see their habits and interest in the subject content. So, while teachers are not the parent with a parent's insight, they recommend students for a course level they believe will offer some challenge but also the best opportunity for success. TRUST the teacher's recommendation. If you decide to waive your student to a more advanced level or drop a level to make room for outside interests and priorities, that will be permitted; however, please know that move is typically final. While we would love to have the flexibility for students to "try out" a course and then change their mind, our master schedule and our finite number of teachers and course sections as well as class size prevent changing in most cases. So, if the work becomes too hard once your child waives up a level or too easy when they slide down a level, refer to the struggle bullet point above and use the situation to help your student take control and learn how to work, seek assistance, and persist through the struggle.
- If grades are more important in your mind than learning, select your level accordingly. We are often asked if a university prefers to see a B or C in an advanced course over an A in a college prep level course the answer is typically they prefer to see your child in courses they are successful in with a stretch course or two showing willingness to challenge themselves.
- Summer coursework taken online through GAVS or other online providers: While these options are certainly open to you, as a school we have no authority to communicate or influence those instructors. Summer break is intended to be a break from learning and rest for the mind as well as family time. Please consider allowing your child (because adulthood comes soon enough) a break this summer. Also, as you know, South Forsyth holds high academic standards in learning for our students and retains excellent faculty and staff. Online coursework often does not carry the same scope and sequence as our coursework. There is no guarantee of placement to the next highest course for summer work completed. We cannot guarantee face-to-face availability. Also, summer work in math and world languages often finds students who re-enter the classroom lacking key skills. Summer course 6 weeks versus yearlong course in person 36 weeks...you get the picture.

Below you will find a host of information that our counseling department has worked extensively to create. You will notice counselors are available to your student many times in many settings for ease of access and convenience. There are parent opportunities as well. Because there are 6 counselors and approximately 2500 students, one-on-one meetings with each student are not feasible. Read carefully the procedures set for communication related to registration for the 2023-24 school year for these have proven most efficient and effective and will be our standard.

Personal emails to counselors related to registration questions will not be prioritized. **Use the system in place.** PLEASE directly contact counselors for all other needs – college admission, mental health, current school year needs and concerns. January through March are remarkably busy times in the counseling world. Your patience is greatly appreciated.

With all of that said, please note a change that will be shared with students in class but that parents absolutely need to know as well. **Missing coursework for the third quarter is due by March 13.** After that date, teachers can review material for feedback purposes but are not obligated to provide a grade. Rationale - students who fail to complete formative work are typically not as successful as though who do; therefore, accepting work for the sake of a grade and not learning weeks and months late will not benefit anyone. Teachers can accept work for a grade past this date but are not obliged to; extenuating circumstances are always granted exceptions.
