PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE



Wishing you a belated “welcome back” to a New Year – the Year of the Rat.

To the many families who donated their unused toiletries, towels, and linen items at the end of last year, thank you! The IHS Women’s and Children’s Center and the Homeless Veterans Center, both in Kalihi both were blessed by your donations this year.

We’re already almost one month though the second semester and our teachers and staff are busy

correcting and addressing the needs of all our student based on their first semester grades and progress.

The second semester is a time of great excitement and anticipation for many students, especially the outgoing 5th grade class. As excited as your child may get, please remind them that they are to remain focused on both their academic performance and behavior. This is a likely time when discipline issues can come up. All Chapter 19 rules and regulations still apply to everyone, so please be aware that a student can lose field trip, May Day, and graduation privileges should they be suspended during these events.

Our morning drop off routine is working well with most people driving slower and not trying to over take another vehicle in the circle driveway or parking lot, but we’ve noticed that afternoon drivers have not been so courteous. We do still notice a few drivers speeding or using their cellular phone when dropping off their child and driving. Please, slow down and pay attention during this time! Talking on the cell phone while driving is illegal and dangerous. The problems that we’ve noticed are that drivers forget where they are and will just sit in their cars talking on the phone, and the cars behind them cannot move since their path is blocked. In other instances, the driver is driving so slowly or having a difficult time turning the steering wheel because they are using only one hand. Please be safe and considerate!

Also, just a quick reminder that should any parent have concerns about their teacher and wants to know if person is qualified for that position, please contact Principal Toyooka and he will share that information with you. Please know that all our classroom teachers meet the DOE parameters and are highly qualified teachers (HQT).

Another safety reminder for families: school hours are from 7:55 a.m. to 1:30 (on Wednesdays) or 2:15 p.m. (Monday, Tuesday, Thursday, and Friday). We do not permit students to go to their classroom, unless accompanied by their parent, before 7:45. The cafe, unless child is in Early Morning Care, opens at 7:00 a.m. so your child can either wait in the cafeteria or have breakfast, which goes until 7:50 a.m. If your child is in the cafe s/he must behave appropriately and listen to the adults working there. If they play or continue to talk loudly they will be sent

outside. We have school personnel outside the cafe who will watch our students starting at 7:30 a.m. This is for their safety.

We have also noticed some children playing on the upper field playground equipment before school starts or after school has ended. At those times, no teacher or school personnel are watching them, but sometimes a parent is. A word of caution to whomever that parent is, you might be putting yourself in a liable position should a child fall and hurt themselves. If you are only watching your own child, then you automatically assume this entire safety responsibility, but when other children start to play with your child this may create a legal matter that can have negative consequences for you. If this happens, it may be a good idea to have your child stop playing and tell the other children to go down to the cafe to prevent this situation. If left unsupervised or improperly supervised, accidents can easily happen. Do not put yourself in a position where other parents are assuming that you are watching their child, as the legal system might put this burden of childcare on you.

Registration for Kindergarten Pupils for SY 2020-2021

The main kindergarten registration period for the Honolulu District schools is designated for February 3 - 14, 2020. This will allow schools time to process registration forms before March 1 geographic exception deadline. Kindergarten registration will continue as necessary throughout the school year. Students who turn five-years old on or before July 31, 2020 may enroll in kindergarten.

PRIVATE SCHOOL APPLICATIONS

Requests for report card and test score copies may be submitted to the **front office** with the following for each private school:

For copies of report cards and test results to be mailed to the private school:

- A Consent for Release of Information form (provided by the private school) signed by parent. Please indicate submission deadlines on the form.
- A stamped envelope addressed to the private school (2 stamps for a standard-sized envelope, 3 stamps for a manila envelope).
- Most private schools request a copy of the first semester report card for the current year. This report card generally is available in late-January; therefore, all transcript documents will be held and mailed out together at that time.
- **Note:** There is a \$0.25 copy charge per page.

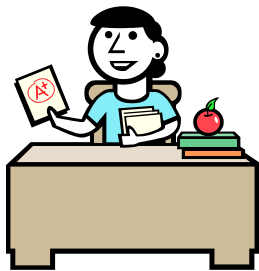
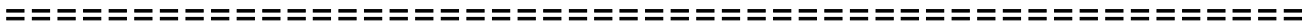
For copies of report cards and test results to be sent home:

- Call or write a note to the office with your request. Copies of the requested documents will be made and sent home in an envelope with your child. (Many private schools allow parents to submit copies of the documents.)
- **Note:** There is a \$0.25 copy charge per page.

Please allow at least one week for processing of all transcript requests.

For letters of recommendation:

- Send letter of recommendation requests directly to your child’s teachers and/or service club advisors **at least one month in advance.**
- **Hard copy recommendations:** Attach a stamped envelope addressed to the private school to **each** form.
- **Online recommendations (via Ravenna, etc.):** Use the following email format for Nu’uanu teachers/staff: Firstname.Lastname@k12.hi.us
- **Administrative Reference Reports:** Submit to the office—They will forward the form(s) to Ms. Davis, Counselor (Kristie.Davis@k12.hi.us).

Flu Season is Upon Us!

Nu‘uanu has had several cases of confirmed **Flu B** in kindergarten, and illness in the upper grades. Symptoms of the flu include fever, complaints range from headache, cough, sore throat, malaise, chills, body aches, and some vomiting. Please make sure that you have an accurate thermometer at home. If your child complains of not feeling well, check their temperature, if there is no fever, use your good judgement in gauging your child's health, we have had some students come in to the health room with symptoms, but no fever that developed into a fever the next day.



With vigilance we can curb the spread of illness and the flu, and we all need to work together to keep Nu‘uanu School healthy. This means teaching children to wash hands frequently, avoid touching the "T" zone (eyes, nose, mouth), as well as coughing and sneezing into elbows. If your child is sick, please keep them at home and monitor temperature. If they develop a fever along with any of the complaints listed, please call your pediatrician.
