It's time to remind you about Credit Union Scholarships. Credit Unions all over the country offer high school students scholarships. Most Credit Union Scholarships are for high school seniors with application deadlines in March, so contact local credit unions for their information.

Working on a scholarship application is an investment in time. The simplest application may take only a short while to fill out, but most require a minimum of 1 to 2 hours to complete. Some scholarships require a huge investment in time. Don't waste your time if you don't meet the eligibility requirements. Read all the scholarship requirements and directions carefully, and make sure that you are eligible. For those scholarship committees that have many thousands of applications to review, this is the easiest way to pare down the competition. Some factors that you should check before applying include: Citizenship, Ethnicity/Minority Status, Academic Accomplishments, Geographic Location and Financial need. We wish you best of luck with your efforts.

Local Scholarships (Great chance of winning!)

Henry County Scholarship Foundation Scholarship – Deadline January 31st Scholarships are awarded for college and vocational programs and are given for \$500, \$750, or \$1000, depending upon several factors, including recipient's qualifications and needs, donor's wishes, and available funds.
