Welcome back and a very Happy New Year to the 4th grade families! This is a great time for your child to reflect on themselves and set goals for the new year. Have a discussion with your child on their personal and school goals. Personal goals could be: 60 minutes of activity daily, organizing bedroom every weekend, or going to bed on time. Goals we are working on in school include coming to school daily and on time, keeping desk, backpack, and daily binder neat, completing logs (reading and iReady) daily, scoring **70% or higher on iReady lessons**, **reading for 20 minutes each day**, and completing work with quality. Each of your children are unique and may need a little more of our support in one or more of these areas to **achieve** and **excel**.

Now that students have completed their second iReady Diagnostic Reading and Math Tests, their individualized weekly lesson requirements have been adjusted. Please take a look at your child's new iReady log for more information.

Welcome back to school! We hope you had a restful winter break and your child is ready to go!

Students completed their Winter iReady Diagnostics before the break. We will be sharing the results with you and your child in the next week or so. They will be looking at areas of growth and areas to work on, as well as setting new goals for their Spring Diagnostics in March.

In Social Studies, we learned about slavery and colonial America. We will be moving into the study of our Constitution very soon. Students are continuing to learn concepts about the patterns of the Earth and sky in Science and are creeping closer to solving the mystery of the missing piece on the artifact. Math has us returning to decimal fractions as we are learning different strategies to add and subtract multiple numbers with and without regrouping. For writing, the quarter ended with students submitting an opinion draft and an informational article draft. We will be publishing these pieces at the start of third quarter.

We have an action packed second semester filled with learning, field trips, Diagnostics, Science testing, and the Smarter Balanced Assessments in Reading and Math. It is very critical that your child be healthy and in school everyday as we prepare them for middle school. One thing that the NGSS (Next Generation Science Standards) emphasizes is that science is something that is all around us, something that we live everyday. The NGSS refers to this as "phenomena." The phenomena can usually be phrased in the form of an everyday question: Why don't trees blow down in the wind? Why is snow white? Why do dogs wash their tails?

Try to begin this year by asking your children about the phenomena around them. See if they can come up with their own questions. These questions come naturally to children, and there is usually no limit to the questions they can come up with.

If you find the time, turn this into a project with your child - use the Internet or the library as a resource for research. Even better, come to with your own ways of finding explanations. You will often be surprised at the results!

Geographic Exception SY 2020-2021

If you know a family who is interested in enrolling at Pauoa Elementary but resides outside our school boundary or if you are interested in enrolling your child to a school outside his/her home school boundary, the GE Application form must be completed and submitted to the home school (for new students) or current school for students who are already enrolled. (The home school serves the geographic area of the child's residence.) GE applications for the upcoming 2020-2021 school year shall be submitted between January 2 and March 2 2020 to facilitate a decision before the end of the school year.

Don't forget to include with your GE application: SASE (Self Addressed Stamped Envelope) and Proof of residency document (e.g. Utility bill)
