- -We have a new found appreciation for life, being safe and loving one another


We will need what we learned from 2020 and expect to apply it to 2021. We have so much to look forward to in 2021. 2021 will be the best year yet.

#### Grade 5: Ms. Nakamura (C9), Mrs. Oliveira (C10)

We welcome you back to school and look forward to 2021! Students completed the iReady Winter Diagnostic before break. We are in the process of conferencing with each student and setting goals for the remainder of the year. Students will be participating in interventions and instruction based on this new set of data. As a reminder, the goal for 5th grade students is to be at Mid 5 or higher by the Spring Diagnostic in March. Students should be striving for passing lessons with a rate of at least 75% accuracy.

Quarter 3 will start with business as usual on January 6, 20201. We are hoping to move to a blended learning model within the first month of school, but this depends on so many variables outside of our control. What we can control is remaining vigilant, staying safe, and making smart choices. Please stay tuned for more information.

The statewide test, SBA, will start in the 4th quarter, but there is no time like the present to build students' stamina. Please make sure your child is completing their homework each night with as little distraction as possible. Students should be able to sustain their concentration and focus for long periods of time, at least 45-60 minutes, with little interruption (tv, electronic devices, smart phones, etc). Building this kind of stamina will help them greatly, not just for the SBA, but also for Middle School.

## **Technology Coordinator**: Mr. Sutherland (C8)

Aloha Pauoa and welcome to our 2<sup>nd</sup> semester. This semester will bring many changes. Many student will be attending in-person classes for the first time this year. One of the biggest tech issues will be students bringing their chrome books to and from school. It is very easy to damage the chrome book during transport. To be successful, make sure your child's chrome book is packed safely in your backpack. Charge the chrome book overnight, and double check to make sure you have packed the charger.

While we will be starting in-person learning, many students will still be participating in distance learning. One of the hardest things to reestablish after an extended break is routines. Here are a few tips for setting up successful routines:

- Little kids need more structure, so make sure to let them know what to expect. You can create a visual schedule they can follow. Older kids can use a calendar, planner, chalkboard, or digital organizer to keep track of what's happening each day.
- Have them follow a routine as if they're going to school (getting dressed, brushing teeth, etc.) instead of lying in bed in their pajamas, which could lead to less learning.
- Breaks are really important, especially for kids with learning and attention issues, so make sure to build those in and break assignments into smaller pieces.



## Message from the Front Office

Geographic Exception SY 2021-2022 If you know a family who is interested in enrolling at Pauoa Elementary but resides outside our school boundary or if you are interested in enrolling your child to a school outside his/her home school boundary, the GE Application form must be completed and submitted to the home school (for new students) or current school for students who are already enrolled. (The home school serves the geographic area of the child's residence.) GE applications for the upcoming 2021-2022 school year shall be submitted between January 1 and March 1, 2021 to facilitate a decision before the end of the school year. If you are currently on a GE to Pauoa, you do not need to re-apply.

Don't forget to include with your GE application: SASE (Self Addressed Stamped Envelope) and Proof of residency document (e.g. Utility bill)


