Throughout second quarter, counselors will be visiting advisories to provide guidance on the process and an overview of the road ahead. Students will be instructed on how to complete a self-reflection and data form which will serve as the foundation for our meetings. While our appointments first semester are reserved for assisting seniors through the application season, we hope students will reach out over email at any time with questions.

Individual meetings will begin second semester and continue throughout the rest of the school year. Prior to the meeting, parents/guardians will be invited to submit a reflection form about your student to share with the post-high school counselor. Details on how to schedule the family meeting will be released as we get closer to that time. After the initial meeting, counselors conduct individual student follow-up meetings to provide ongoing support through the entire college search, application and decision making process.

PHSC IS NOW ON CANVAS

All students in the Class of 2025 are enrolled in our PHSC Canvas page. This resource is meant to be a one-stop resource hub for students for anything and everything related to their post-high school planning needs. We hope students will take time to acquaint themselves with the wide variety of resources available at their finger-tips in this site.

TESTING BASICS & UPDATES

The ACT and/or SAT align with a standard high school curriculum, and thus are intended to be taken during the spring of junior year through fall of senior year. Taking the test too early could yield less desirable results, and serve to increase anxiety around testing. Rest assured, students will have access to multiple national test dates throughout second semester, which can be viewed on the [ACT](#) and [CollegeBoard](#) sites. Many colleges have amended their requirements as it pertains to standardized testing. For a current list of colleges now offering a test optional route for admission, please click [here](#). The post-high school counseling department continues to monitor the evolving landscape of standardized testing to keep our families informed on the latest updates. **Please know when registering for an exam, the registration is handled by the testing agencies, thus New Trier has no ability to reserve seats specifically for our students.

ONLINE PLANNING TOOLS

While the Class of 2025 still currently has access to Naviance (which was introduced sophomore year), the PHSC department will be unveiling MaiaLearning to juniors and their parents. MaiaLearning is a comprehensive online planning tool to assist students with college and career preparation, career planning and self-exploration. We are excited about how personalized and intuitive this new online planning tool will be for our students in guiding them about the opportunities after graduation. NET PRICE CALCULATOR

All colleges are federally mandated to have a Net Price Calculator on their website. To find an individual school's calculator, click [here](#). Completing this 15-20 minute exercise will provide you with an early read on what need-based or merit-based aid you might qualify for at this institution.

FEDERAL STUDENT AID ESTIMATOR

The FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Aid) cannot be completed until December 1 of the senior year, but the Federal Student Aid Estimator can be completed now to get an estimate of your eligibility for federal aid. Click [here](#) to access.
