## **COMING UP THIS YEAR**

Next Steps for Juniors Post-High School Planning Night November 13 or 14, 7-8pm Gaffney Auditorium, Winnetka Campus Click <u>HERE</u> for more details and to see which night your counselor is presenting.

Currently, if juniors have questions they may email their counselor or stop by our offices in room 201 on any drop-in day. Throughout second quarter, counselors will be visiting adviseries to provide guidance on the post-high school planning process and an overview of the road ahead. Students will be instructed on how to complete a self-reflection and data form, which serves as the foundation for our initial meetings.

Individual meetings will begin second semester and continue throughout the rest of the school year. Prior to the meeting, parents/guardians will be invited to submit a reflection form about your student to share with the post-high school counselor. Details on how to schedule the family meeting will be released as we get closer to that time. After the initial meeting, counselors conduct individual student follow-up meetings to provide ongoing support through the entire college search, application and decision making process. We hold office hours throughout the summer for individual follow-up appointments as well as host essay and application workshops.

### PHSC CANVAS COURSE

All students in the Class of 2026 are enrolled in our PHSC Canvas page. This resource is meant to be a one-stop resource hub for students for anything and everything related to their post-high school planning needs. We hope students will take time to acquaint themselves with the wide variety of resources available at their fingertips in this site.

## **TESTING BASICS & UPDATES**

The ACT and/or SAT align with a standard high school curriculum, and thus are intended to be taken during the spring of junior year through fall of senior year. Taking the test too early could yield less desirable results, and serve to increase anxiety around testing. Rest assured, students will have access to multiple national test dates throughout second semester, which can be viewed on the ACT and CollegeBoard sites. Many colleges have amended their requirements as it pertains to standardized testing. For a current list of colleges offering a test optional route for admission, please click here. The post-high school counseling department continues to monitor the evolving landscape of standardized testing to keep our families informed on the latest updates. \*\*Please know when registering for an exam, the registration is handled by the testing agencies, thus New Trier has no ability to reserve seats specifically for our students.

This year, the ACT is the Illinois State-mandated test and will take place at New Trier Winnetka Campus on Wednesday, April 9, 2025. For juniors who have registered to take the PSAT, the test will be given at New Trier on Saturday, October 19. ### NET PRICE CALCULATOR


All colleges are federally mandated to have a Net Price Calculator on their website. To find an individual school's calculator, click <u>here</u>. Completing this 15–20-minute exercise will provide you with an early read on what need-based or merit-based aid you might qualify for at this institution.

### FEDERAL STUDENT AID ESTIMATOR

The FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) cannot be filed until December 1 of senior year, but the Federal Student Aid Estimator can be done now to get an estimate of your federal aid eligibility. Click <u>here</u> to access.

## Navigating College Admission Testing.


