All students will be empowered and engaged in learning through a multi-tiered system of support to demonstrate academic and social-emotional growth in order to achieve life-success (college, career, community). To achieve this the focus will be on literacy, social-emotional learning, strong family and community connections, and real-world connections.

Outcome: By the end of SY22-23	Rationale:
<p>By the end of sy22-23:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> → All students should be reading on grade level and make at least one year's growth in reading and math achievement as measured with the iReady diagnostic. → SBA Scores should reflect at least a 10% increase from the 21-22sy scores and ideally we would see more than 50% of all students proficient in Math, Reading and Science. → All students will have benefited from strategic and high quality core instruction in Reading so we see acceleration in reading achievement that lends to their ability to engage in Science and Social Studies content standards. 	<p>Scores in Reading, Math and Science have been declining since the 2016-17sy; and are at an all time low as reflected in the 2020-21sy data. We know that if students in elementary school cannot read, they will not perform well in Math or Science.</p>
