## Attendance Reminders:

- -If a student is absent for more than 1.5 hours but less than 4 hours, he/she is marked absent for a half day.
- -If a student is absent for 4 or more hours, he/she will be marked absent the whole day.
- -Students are tardy if they come in after 8 a.m.



## Car Pool Line Reminders:

#### **Morning Drop offs**

Please make sure your student is on the passenger side of the vehicle and ready to get out when the adult on duty comes to open the door. Remember, all students must be in the building by 8:00am or they are tardy.

## **Afternoon Pickups**

Please make sure that you have your student's school issued car pickup tag displayed in your window on the driver side during pickups. If someone else comes to pick your child up, please make sure they have a car pickup tag. If you need additional copies of your student's tag, please let us know. Without the pickup tag, you will have to come into the school and show identification before your child is released to you. (The name of the person picking up the student should be on the student's information sheet.) This is a safety feature put in place to protect your child. Also, remember that we do not allow left hand turns from Isabella Street into WCPS during afternoon dismissal.

## Title II, Part A Guidance - Right to Know

## Parent's Right to Request a Teacher's and a Paraprofessional's Qualifications:

By law, WCSD is required to notify parents that they may request information regarding the teacher's or the paraprofessional's qualifications, including the following:

- Whether the teacher/paraprofessional has met the Georgia Professionals Standards Commission's certification requirements for the grade level and subject areas in which the teacher provides instruction;
- Whether the teacher is teaching under an emergency or other provisional status through which Georgia qualifications or certification criteria have been waived;
- The college major and any graduate certification or degree held by the teacher;
- Whether the student is provided services by paraprofessionals, and if so, their qualifications.

Reading with Grandparents at WCPS: To celebrate Grandparents Day and to let our WCPS grandparents know how important we know they are, all grandparents of WCPS students are invited to visit their grandchild's classroom. Grandparents of Kindergarten and First Grade students are invited to visit on Wednesday, September 14<sup>th</sup> from 10:00-11:00. ## Worth County School District Direction:


- Our direction for the Worth County School District is for our graduation rate to reach 80% or above, and for students to meet or exceed established accountability measures.
