Important Reminders for Parents:

ABSENCES: If your child will be/is absent, please be sure to contact our school office at (808) 727-4500. School attendance is vital to your child's learning; please keep healthy so your child can attend daily!

DROP-OFF: Please remember, no students should be on campus prior to 7:00 AM. We do not have campus supervision prior to 7:00 AM and it is not safe for them to be unattended.

DISMISSAL: Thank you for the continued patience and understanding. To help dismissal go smoother and safer, please:

- 1. Ensure your child knows how they are going home daily (ex. bus, A+, meeting at a gate, getting picked up/by who, etc.)
- 2. Follow traffic flow/lanes do NOT weave in and out or make your own lane as it's not safe, accidents occur and it causes more congestion. Move forward when possible to keep the flow
- 3. On Tue/Thu the bus arrives at 2:30 PM for pick-up we appreciate your understanding.
- 4. WEDNESDAYS school ends early at 1:15 PM.
