I am writing in support of the modification request from Las Americas ASPIRA Academy to expand to 12<sup>th</sup> grade. This charter modification is an essential part of establishing a biliteracy pathway for students from kindergarten to college and career in Delaware.

Las Americas ASPIRA Academy (LAAA) Opened in 2011 as the first Spanish/English immersion charter school in Delaware. In its first year of operation, there were 300 students in grades K-5, and there are currently 785 students enrolled in grades K-8. In learning a second language, 80% of LAAA's graduates have earned a minimum of one World Language Credit prior to transitioning to high school, with over 50% of those students earning two or more credits as a result of their dual language immersion experience. LAAA's dual language immersion program has proven to be effective in supporting their English learners as measured by the number of students transitioned out of ELL services each year. In the Spring of 2017, there were four students that transitioned out of ELL services compared to 17 students in the Spring of 2018. The majority of those students were in 4<sup>th</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup> grades. From these statistics, it is clear that ASPIRA Academy is promoting academic success for both ELL and non-ELL student populations.

According to the Migration Policy Institute, from 1997 until 2008, Delaware's ELL enrollment grew by 249%, and Delaware is listed as one of the top 10 states with significant increases in ELL enrollment. These numbers have continued to rise with a total of 11,082 ELLs in the 2016-2017 school year, a 433.3% increase. In Sussex County alone, between 1990 and 2010, the Hispanic population grew from 1,476 to 16,954. Among Delaware's ELL group, Spanish is the number one language of origin, with students from more than 15 Latin American countries represented. It is becoming more important in Delaware to support ELL students, and ASPIRA has proven their ability to support and promote success among ELLs.

An October 2018 survey of LAAA families revealed strong interest (86%) in having students continue their education in an ASPIRA high school. As a legislator and prior chair of the Senate Education Committee, I have witnessed ASPIRA's success firsthand. I have full faith in Margie Lopez Waite's ability as the Head of School to take Las Americas ASPIRA Academy to the next step in achieving success. Expanding LAAA to 12<sup>th</sup> grade will allow students to continue their biliteracy pathway to college and career.

Dear Charter School Accountability Committee:

As a retired professional whose involvement in public school education dates to the early 1970s when I represented Hispanic children in starting the bilingual program in the Wilmington public schools and later represented them in the remedy stage of the desegregation case, I support the LAAA charter school's application to amend its charter to expand its program through high school.

Not only would such an expansion serve the younger children currently at the LAAA school, but it would also serve the larger Delaware community in that it would better enable our state to compete in what increasingly is a global market. I believe that out of state companies would be attracted to locate in Delaware if they see that there is a bilingual workforce. An expansion through high school of the LAAA program would facilitate such a workforce and would serve as a model in this state for this type of education through the high school years. To the best of my knowledge, there is no similar program currently available in Delaware at the high school level.

I understand that one person expressed a concern at a prior meeting that about half of the past graduates of the LAAA school have previously enrolled in vocational schools. I also understand that a survey conducted by the school found that 87 % of the school's families indicated a preference for enrolling their children in an Aspira high school if one became available. This is noteworthy since it indicates confidence in the current school program for the lower grades and makes me wonder whether the students who enrolled in vocational schools would have enrolled in a bilingual immersion high school instead if one had been available to them. It is not possible to know until such a high school becomes a reality. As the old saying goes, "if you build it, they will come." I believe that if such a high school became available, it would be attractive to many students beyond the Aspira school community. The best test would be to permit the expansion and test this proposition. Given the LAAA's experience with a waiting list since its inception, I am willing to predict that a similar waiting list would develop for a high school program before too long.
