STEPS TO COMPLETION

- 1. You will be assigned a partner, with whom you will complete the project.
- 2. You and your partner will reflect on all of the literary concepts you have learned this semester. (Make a list of concepts that you remember).
- 3. From this list you and your partner will narrow down your choices to your 2 most favorite concepts.
- 4. As a team you make a Public Service announcement (PSA) that is catered toward the importance of this concept.

STEPS TO COMPLETION

■ 5. Make your PSA creative (rap, song, creative recitation). You will also include examples of the concept you chose from a text we studied in class.

■ 6. Use Literacy Project Graphic Fact Organizer to gather you information related to the topic/concept you choose.

■ 7. Use Literacy Project Script to write what you are going to say in your PSA. (Recitation, Song, or rap).

CONSIDER THE FOLLOWING

- How did these concepts impact your learning?
- Be sure that you and your partner are able to thoroughly explain the items you choose.
- How did these concepts make you a better reader?
- What will you remember most about these concepts?
- How can you gather this information into a creative presentation? Scripts, song, rap. (Poetry examples and text samples to be included.

EXAMPLE/SCRIPT

What are literary elements	A literary element (Or element of literature) is an individual aspect or characteristic of a whole work of literature.
Some examples are:	Plot, setting, conflict, characters, antagonist, and protagonist, solution.
Why are literary elements important?	They help us make sense of what we
	read, especially if the text has an intricately woven plot.
How do authors use literary elements?	Author's use the elements to convey meaning, expose ideas.

Plot	Action that occurs in a story (Example)
Antagonist	The villain/person in conflict with the protagonist (Example-Jafar)
