Early Release Wednesdays A Note from Our Superintendent

Beginning Wednesday, October 14 dismissal times on Wednesdays will be adjusted in order to provide additional time for teachers to develop and enhance your child's instruction. Though this may cause you to make adjustments in your family's schedule, this is an important opportunity for teachers many who teach both brick and mortar and distance learning students. There will be a 50-minute adjustment to dismissal on Wednesdays. Middle schools will release at 12:00 pm, Elementary and K-8 Academies will release at 12:55 pm, and High Schools will release at 2 pm. This 50-minute adjustment also provides the ability to allocate each school's maintenance/custodial team to sanitize high traffic areas such as corridors, cafetorium's, and media centers during an additional unoccupied period.

The total time in school each week continues to exceed the required instructional minutes set by the state. Each school will communicate any specific changes that may be necessary or unique to their school. Thank you for your support as we focus on high quality learning in our schools.

Accelerated Reader at OMES

This Fall we are thrilled to announce that your child has access to the Accelerated Reader (AR™) program. This guide is designed to answer your questions about AR. If you have additional questions, please feel free to contact your child's teacher, our Media Specialist, <u>Mrs. Bendt</u> or visit the Accelerated Reader website at <u>www.renlearn.com/ar.</u>

1. What is Accelerated Reader (AR)?

AR is a computer program that helps teachers manage and monitor children's independent reading practice. Your child chooses a book at his/her own level and reads it at his own pace. When finished, your child takes a short quiz on the computer. (Passing the quiz is an indication that your child understood what was read.) AR gives both children and teachers feedback based on the quiz results, which the teacher then uses to help your child set goals and direct ongoing reading practice.

Children using AR choose their own books to read, rather than having one assigned to them. This makes reading a much more enjoyable experience as they can choose books that are interesting to them.

Teachers and librarians help your child choose books at an appropriate reading level that are challenging without being frustrating, ensuring that your child can pass the quiz and experience success.


2. How much will my child read during the school day?

According to research, children who read at least 20 minutes a day with a 90% comprehension rate (average percent correct) on AR quizzes see the greatest gains. Therefore, your child should have at least 20 minutes set aside for reading during each school day.

Destiny Card Catalog welcomes you and your student for book browsing and check-out. When a student signs in to our Destiny Library, they are able to view their account status, place holds and borrow electronic books.



As with anything, performance improves with practice. Encourage your child to read at home. Create a culture of reading in your household by reading with your child, starting a home library, visiting your local library or bookstore on a regular basis, letting your child see you reading, and discussing books that each of you has read. When reading with your child, stop and ask questions to be sure your child is comprehending what is read. Reading with your child, no matter what the child's age, is an important part of developing a good reader, building a lifelong love of reading and learning, and creating a loving relationship between you and your child. Make learning a family affair!

4. Can we read books together, at home to help our child successfully complete a quiz?

Sure! Quizzes are available during school days from 8:00 am to 3:00 pm. The access link can be found on <u>Links for Students</u> page.

5. Can students read an electronic eBook for an AR quiz?

When you are browsing for books from the Mason library, simply check the title for an AR quiz. The majority of our eBooks support AR testing.

The AR Bookfinder allows you to check any book to see if it is an AR title that has a quiz.

The Accelerated Reader icon signs each student into the interface for reading quizzes as well as vocabulary challenges and teacher-assigned articles for reading.

Costumes on Halloween

Students may wear costumes to school if:

Masks & Temperature Checks –

Masks are to be worn by all students until a temperature check is completed and they can socially distance themselves from others. Please make sure your child has a mask and it is labeled with his/her name.

Temperature checks will occur upon arrival. Any student with a temperature at or above 100.4 degrees will be referred to the nurse and a parent/guardian will be responsible for picking up his/her student.

Student Health Screening -

We appreciate your assistance in supporting our health and safety protocols here on campus. As a reminder, below is the student health screener questions. If you can say yes to any of the questions below for your child, please keep your child at home until you can say no to all questions or have a clearance from the local Department of Health or your medical care provider. Please contact Nurse Baxa at 547-8444.

Student Health Screening Entry Form

Please assess your child daily for the following symptoms and answer the contact questions.

- Fever of 100.4 or higher
- Uncontrolled cough
- Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing
- Sore throat
- Loss of sense of smell or taste
- Muscle aches
- Vomiting or diarrhea
- Is your child currently awaiting COVID-19 test results? If yes, please keep your child home and notify the school nurse when test results received. Further instructions will be discussed at that time.
- Does your child live in the same household with someone positive for COVID-19? If yes, your child must quarantine for 14 days from the last date of contact with the positive individual. A negative test result does not reduce the quarantine requirement for the full 14-day incubation period.
- Has your child had close contact with someone who in the past 14 days who tested positive for COVID-19? If yes, your child must quarantine for 14 days from the last date of contact with the positive individual. A negative test result does not reduce the quarantine requirement for the full 14-day incubation period.



Dress Code Reminders -

- Hats, sunglasses, etc. must be taken off and put away upon arrival (except in case of medical necessity or special events authorized by administration). These items may only be worn outside.
- Shoes must be safe and appropriate. They must have a back no flip-flops, heels, etc.
- > No tank tops, spaghetti straps, or shirts/dresses that are cut out at midriff.
- Clothing must be free of logos or sayings with profanity, violence, drugs, alcohol, or tobacco or anything that would be disruptive to the learning environment.
- Skirts and shorts must be no shorter than 4 inches above the knee. Leggings are permitted to be worn under a skirt or long sweater/skirt. No yoga pants.
- > Hair should be a natural color and styled in a way that is not distracting.
- No excessive make-up.

Special Celebrations –

We love to celebrate when there is a special occasion! However, we ask that you please follow these guidelines if your child is celebrating while at school:

- Treats must be cookies, brownies, or anything sweet that is ICING FREE. No cupcakes, regular cakes or cookie cakes will be permitted. Icing is too messy and contains too much sugar!
- Treats may only be shared with your child's classmates and teacher.
- ▶ If needed, napkins, plates and/or utensils should be provided to the teacher.
- Communicate with your child's teacher about when you would like to bring something in, what you will be bringing and check if there are any allergies in the class. You will need to work with the teacher to determine the best time to have the treat (lunch or recess).
- > No balloons or banners are permitted. Special shirts or buttons are allowed.
- > Birthday invitations must include everyone in the class if they are being handed out at school.

Interpreter Requests -

If you need an interpreter for an event at Mason, we ask you to send a request in writing at least two weeks in advance of the event. The school and/or district will arrange for the interpreter, but we need your help in asking to notify us as far in advance as you can. Please communicate these requests with your child's teacher and the Assistant Principal (<u>Jill.Hillier@stjohns.k12.fl.us</u>).

We also ask that you let us know as soon as possible if you need to cancel a prearranged interpreter. This is an additional expense to the SJCSD, so we appreciate your consideration and helping us to be conscious of these costs.
