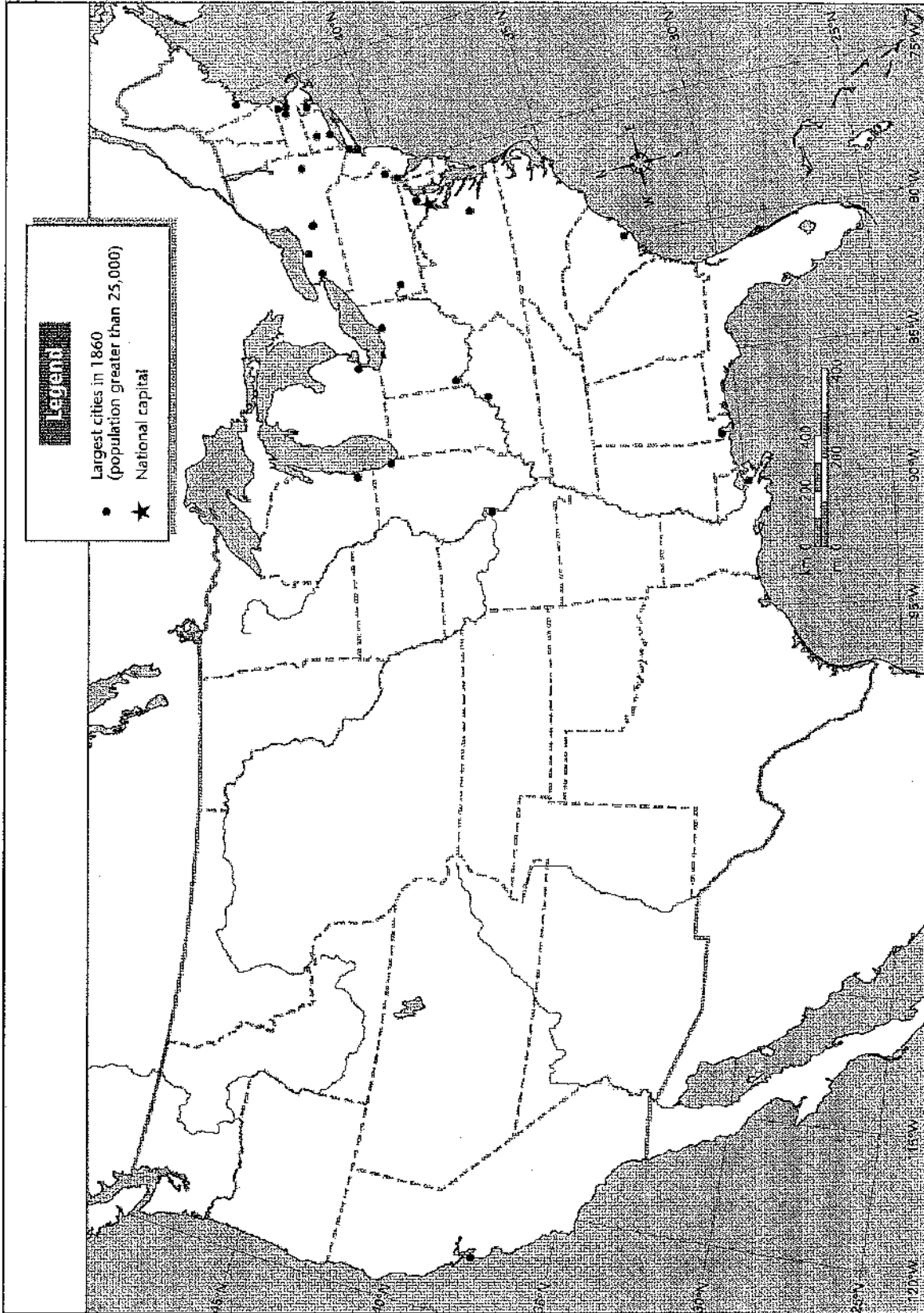

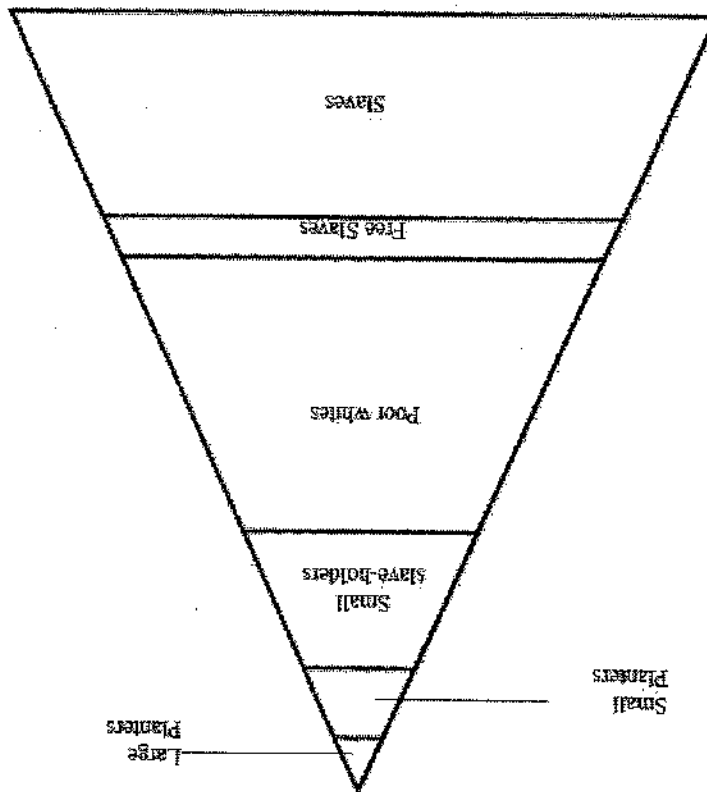

South scores victory as Union troops flee back to Washington in disarray. Lincoln replaces McDowell with General McClellan, who has a reputation for discipline and training.
