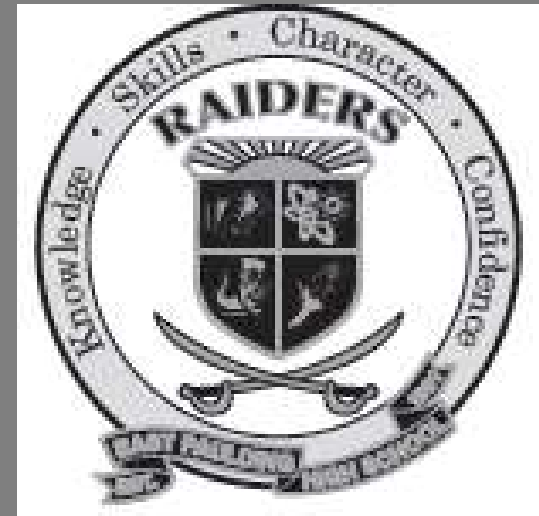

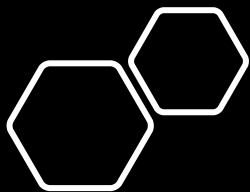

# AP Updates for AP Parents / Guardians

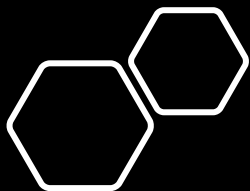

- Encourage your child to take AP Exams so they have the chance to stand out to college admissions officers and save money on tuition with a qualifying exam score.
- Ensure your child checks in with their AP teacher by 03/12/21 to confirm they are registered for their AP Exams as March 12 is the final deadline to register for the exams.

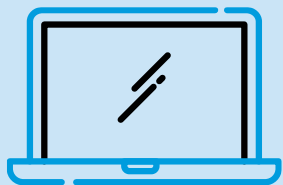

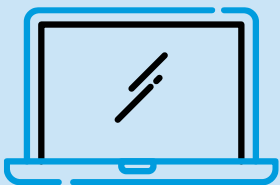
# Digital Exams: An Overview

## Planning Your Exam Administration

Whether digital exams are given in school or taken at home, schools are responsible for ensuring that all requirements for digital testing are met and that students complete all setup and readiness steps before exam day and abide by exam security policies while testing.

The following details apply to all digital exams, whether administered in school or at home, except for Chinese and Japanese exams.

# AP DIGITAL EXAMS

- **Practice:** Beginning **April 8**, students and educators will be able to access the digital testing application and practice with each type of multiple-choice and free-response question students will see on exam day. Digital exam practice will also confirm students' technology and let students practice using the tools and features in the digital testing application.
- **All versions of an AP Exam**, whether paper or digital, cover the same content, use the same question types, and in most cases have the exact same number of multiple-choice and free-response questions.

# Paulding County Schools Guidance

- **Administration 1 (testing window 1)– Traditional Paper and Pencil**
- AP students who are face to face will take the traditional paper and pencil exam on their designated day during the Administration 1 testing window.
- Virtual AP students will be ***given the option*** to come into their home school to take the exam during Administration 1.
  
- **Admin 2 & Admin 3 – Digital**
- Virtual AP students will be given the option to take their AP exam digitally either in school or at home.
- Face to face students who have been quarantined at the time of their paper and pencil test will be allowed to take their AP exam digitally at home or at school.
- Students who do not have the required equipment to take the digital test at home can take it at school.
