Reading: I am so excited as we continue our journey westward! We'll merge with Social Studies and ELA to help kids utilize their Reading Informational skills through research, learning, and hands-on activities. Your child will have multiple opportunities to utilize their devices in class. However, please know that your child must have a signed BYOT form on file. You can check with your child's homeroom teacher if you don't remember. We will review expectations for technology in class next week.

Language Arts: We are continuing to integrate with Social Studies and Reading as we read close passages about Westward Expansion and the Oregon Trail. We will use these paired passages to write about the hardships and difficulties of the journey and our opinion about the most dangerous part of the trip. We are supporting our writing with details and evidence from these passages. We will continue to review prepositions as we locate them in our own writing. We will also begin learning about Greek and Latin root words, as well as affixes (prefixes and suffixes). Our next genre of writing will be narrative as we prepare for our final Stop, Drop, and Write on March 30th. All students will be expected to write (type) a narrative on the Georgia Milestones Assessment.

Math:

We will continue our unit on fractions. So far we have covered equivalent fractions, comparing fractions, decomposing fractions as well as addition and subtraction of fractions with like denominators. We have also discussed improper fractions as well as mixed numbers. We will continue with mixed numbers, and improper fractions we will also begin working with multiplication of fractions. Please continue to encourage your child to complete the homework sheet that comes home weekly this keeps previously learned skills fresh in the student's minds. Science/Social Studies:

This week will be continuing our Force and Motion science unit. We will also learn about different simple machines and how they make work easier. Students will begin a plan on paper for a fun project which includes the use of simple machines. More news for that will follow.
