This support is available to families with children in any learning model, and your request for assistance will remain private. Thank you!

Spring is here! We will continue to be working on letter recognition and formation, as well as the letter sounds (phonics) on a daily basis. At this point in the year, students should have a firm grasp on recognizing all letters and their sounds. If your child is still struggling with this, please practice nightly. Please encourage your child to be reading and writing at home to practice these skills. It is important that you take the time at home to read at least 15-20 per day with your child daily. Discuss the story and ask comprehension questions such as who, what, why, when and where. This is an important Kindergarten skill that will help your child perform better not only in testing situations, but overall academically. Sight word recognition is another important skill for Kindergarten. We will be assessing sight word knowledge at the end of the quarter. If you need a list of the sight words introduced so far, please contact your child's teacher.

Please remember that you are able to use I-Ready at home for reading and math. This program will focus on your child's specific needs, as well as assignments that your child's teacher can provide if extra practice of a skill is needed. If you need your child's log in, please contact his/her teacher.

In math, we will continue our unit on addition and subtraction. We will also start our unit on reading, writing, and representing numbers to 20. Our science and social studies will incorporate motion, earth and space, and weather. In March, the classes will be having an author study and celebrating Dr. Seuss' birthday, as well as an author study on Eric Carle. More information to come about these great learning experiences!

There will be one final supply pick up for our Seminole Connect Families before Spring Break. Be on the lookout for an email from Mrs. Hopkins as to when that will be. The pickup will have all the materials needed for the rest of the school year, so it will be important that you make sure to pick up these supplies before Spring Break as you will be using them once we return. As always, please feel free to contact your child's teacher with any questions or concerns.



Hello First Grade Families, and Happy March! We are excited for Spring Break and hope you are planning some relaxing time with family.

We've been working hard in the classroom, so be sure to have lots of opportunities to get outside and PLAY during break! As usual, we are incredibly busy. You should notice that reading is becoming easier for your child. Keep reviewing sight words, and always talk about the books being read. Ask your child to retell the story and describe the characters. Don't forget to include nonfiction books in read alouds—first graders typically LOVE nonfiction! In class, we will continue to gather information from nonfiction sources and make connections. Soon we will move on to a study of poetry!

In Math, we will be adding and subtracting within 100 with deeper understanding using two-digits. In Science, we will conclude our Necessities of Life unit and start our unit on Plant Parts, which will continue throughout April. Face to Face students will be planting seeds and observing their growth! In Social Studies, we will begin to learn about basic map elements using cardinal directions, map keys and symbols. As always, we thank you for your support and, if you have any questions or concerns, please reach out to us. Have a great month!

In March we continue to work on what good readers do such as visualizing, questioning, monitoring and clarifying while we read. Second graders will revisit fact and opinion as well as text features. They will also discuss main topic and compare and contrast while reading. In Social Studies will begin Goods and Services and Wants vs. Needs. In Science we move to the Human Body; bones, muscles and organs and then we move on to Life Cycles of plants and animals. In math we are working on Time and Money. Identifying and counting coins are a big one. A helpful way to ensure success of your student is to let them count change at home and practice making different amounts with different coins. In Time we are learning the Analog Clock and how to read the minute and hour hand, half hour and hour, along with telling time to 5 minutes. If you have an analog clock at home have your child tell you what time it is through out the day to practice.

Thank you so much for continuing to support your children and their teachers by making sure that rules are being followed and proper respect is being given. Everyone is working hard and together we can make sure that your child is the best that they can possibly be.

Eastbrook Local News: Intermediate Classes

In ELA, students will be finishing a review of text features and text structures and moving on to text-based writing. In the fourth quarter, they will conclude their study of how illustrations contribute to the meaning of the text and will review how to distinguish their point of view from that of the author.

Our young mathematicians are expanding their knowledge of measurement as they learn to tell time to the minute, distinguish a.m. activities from p.m. activities and determine how much time has elapsed between activities. In addition, they will be measuring the volume of liquids. The next unit of study will be on area and perimeter. Students are encouraged to continue learning their addition, subtraction and multiplication facts.

As we approach the start of Spring, our third graders are learning about plant structures and their roles as well as how plants respond to light, gravity and heat. Their next unit will focus on plant and animal classification.

As the third quarter ends, we encourage parents to ensure that students continue cultivating sound academic habits such as: 1) reading actively which includes looking up unfamiliar words and using context clues as well as being able to answer who, what, where, why and how; 2) practicing active listening at home as well as at school; 3) keeping a daily reading log and 4) expanding their knowledge by reading/viewing informational texts and programs. As always, please contact your student's teacher with questions regarding their academic progress. Thank you for your continued support and involvement in your child's education.

Skyward Family Access is a web-based component of Skyward, our student information system. This access will enable parents to take an unprecedented and much more proactive role in their student's education. This access is secured by a

unique username and password that you set up when you provide the school with your email address. There is also a <u>SKYWARD FAMILY ACCESS</u> app for Android and Apple devices that makes checking on your child's progress very easy. If you do not have online access to skyward, please come to the front office and ask for a form.

Spring is upon us! This year seems to have gone by very quickly and it is hard to believe that we are starting to prepare for next year already! ELA classes are continuing to practice text-based writing daily to prepare for the FSA Writing test coming up in April. We are also spending time understanding more about historical, scientific, and technical texts to help us with our informational comprehension. We will continue to learn new reading strategies and concepts throughout the springtime while we also review past strategies for spring testing. In math, your students will learn different ways to identify, draw, and describe plane shapes. This will include naming, drawing, and measuring angles with a protractor. You can reinforce these concepts by pointing out the attributes of shapes around your house or in the car! Shape attributes include parallel, perpendicular, acute angles, symmetry, etc. Multiplication and division skills are related to some of these skills so please continue to practice fact fluency! Please continue to remind your child to keep working hard on weekly activities in and out of school such as homework, iReady minutes, etc. With FSA rapidly approaching, this constant practice will help greatly! Also, please continue to check Skyward to ensure that your child does not have any missing work. Thank you for your support!

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In like a Lion and out like a Lamb, March is upon us already! The students have been working hard and hope to enjoy a well-deserved Spring Break!

At the conclusion of their unit on climate and weather, fifth grade students attended a Q and A virtually with Eric Burress, a local meteorologist and television fan favorite. A big round of thanks to Mrs. Stewart who organized this informative event. Next, they will be studying Life Science and the Environment.

In math, the fifth graders continue to hone their fractions skills, including multiplication and division of fractions.

In ELA, they continue to practice organized writing with colorful elaborations.

Social Studies brings forth a new country busy expanding westward. The children have enthusiastically researched historical characters from this time period and have learned a great deal about U.S. icons and the American Experience.

The idea for this challenge came from "Caine's Arcade." You may want to check it out online. Fourth graders are learning how architectural engineers create blueprints, or plans, to build a structure. Each student is building a tiny house using specific criteria and constraints. Fifth graders are exploring the six simple machines and constructing different pieces of playground equipment to demonstrate how a simple machine works.
