Elementary Growth:

- 2007-2008 Opened Wards Creek Elementary
- 2012-2013 Opened Palencia Elementary
- 2017-2018 Opened Picolata Crossing Elementary



K-8 Success: Growth Management & Academics Success

- Research has shown K-8 schools achieve continued academic success
- Less transition for students increases engagement in 6th grade year and minimizes social-emotional adjustments common to adolescents
- Currently 3 K-8 schools in the District with a proven track record of high academic achievement
- Ability to address 9 grades of student growth in one facility.



K-8 Success: Growth Management & Academics Success

- Educational Plant Survey and Five-Year District Facilities Work Plan show a need for the construction of middle school seats
- Middle School Growth:
 - 2007-2008 Opened Pacetti Bay Middle School
 - 1022 Permanent Capacity
 - Geographically serves 4 growing Elementary Schools
 - Current enrollment: 1488 students



K-8 Success: Growth Management & Academics Success

- The K-8 School provides an opportunity for the District to provide
 - Stability
 - Consistency in student population and attendance zone
 - An answer to the continued growth

Mill Creek Elementary (K-5) Middle School students from same attendance zone (6-8)

FIRST Conversion of an Elementary School to a K-8 **SCHOOL** in St. Johns County



- Current 5th graders will remain at Mill Creek to start the transition to a K-8 School (approx. 120 students)
 - 2018-2019 SY K-6 school
 - 2019-2020 SY K-7 school
 - 2020-2021 SY K-8 school
- Provides Immediate relief to Pacetti Bay Middle School
- The opening of K-8 Schools KK & LL with grades K-6 for the first year, allows an opportunity for synergy with outstanding principal leadership



- Academics:
 - Standard and Advanced courses in 4 core areas (English Language Arts, Math, Science and Social Studies)
 - Music
 - Visual Arts
 - Physical Education (PE)
 - PK Program to be transferred to Picolata Crossing Elementary School



- School will start at 8:30 a.m. and release at 2:50 p.m. There will be a one-hour early release on Wednesday at 1:50 p.m.
- The media center will have a collection of both traditional books and eBooks serving both the elementary and middle school students.



- Interscholastic Athletics (SJCSD):
 - Volleyball and Basketball
 - 6th Grade schedule to be developed with other K-8 schools (for one year)
 - Will work with Pacetti Bay Middle School for use of the gymnasium for first year.



- Attendance Zone changes will begin immediately to rezone middle school students contained in the Mill Creek Elementary zone to the new K-8 zone
- These students are currently zoned to Pacetti Bay and R. J. Murray Middle Schools
- Rising 7th and 8th graders within this zone will continue to attend their current middle school.



Conversion to K-8: Timeline

- Summer 2018: Site Preparation and establishment of construction boundaries vs. student use boundaries
- 2018-2019 SY: New Construction of 2-story Middle School classroom building, K-8 gymnasium and locker rooms, Dining Expansion and covered PE
- Initial Project Estimate of \$15 Million
