The class will integrate concepts from the Math, Social Studies, Science and Language Arts Curriculum to enhance comprehension in Music, as well as to improve student performance on standardized tests.

- Please demonstrate good audience and performer etiquette during class, practical exams, and performances. Students will lose grade points if proper etiquette is not demonstrated.

Consequences for not following the rules:

1<sup>st</sup> infraction- remind student of conduct expectations.

2<sup>nd</sup> infraction- Warning and student conference.

3<sup>rd</sup> infraction- Phone call home to parent.

4<sup>th</sup> infraction- See you after school for detention.

5<sup>th</sup> infraction- Parental Conference requested, referral to Assistant Principal/Principal for further disciplinary action and loss of class rewards.

## Class Goals: Our class goals are inclusive of: Georgia/Henry County Schools/GSE Standard Objectives

- performing on at least one instrument (recorder or piano keyboard accurately and independently simple rhythms and accompaniments.
- listening to, analyzing and describing music.
- Evaluating music and music performances
- Reading and notating music
- Connecting music to history and culture

Make Up/ Extra Credit Policy: Students may make up written assignments if there is an extenuating circumstance such as illness, family crisis, death in family, board approved field trips, doctor's appointments, etc. The teacher needs to be notified of the circumstance via a note, phone call or email from a parent and make –up work will be assigned on a case-by-case basis. This work must be made up within one week of said absence. Performances done outside of normal school hours (evening concerts, weekend performances, after school performances will receive extra credit. Performance- based exams scheduled during the school day that are missed due to the student's refusal to perform or an unexcused absence cannot be made up and will affect a student's grade.
