TEXT: A Nation Conceived in Liberty: US History for the Georgia EOC Assessment Author- Mark Jarrett, Ph.D. The text will be provided to the student and should be brought to class daily. The text is consumable and students will be expected to to write in their copy throughout the year. If a replacement copy is needed, the cost is \$16.00.

1. COURSE DESCRIPTION: Course-the main purpose of this course is to provide students with a comprehensive survey of American History that will help them understand their own era. The course will show the continuity of history, and the sweeping forces that shaped events and influences of each era upon succeeding times.

2. GRADING POLICY: 50%-Assessments

30%-Classwork/ Projects

10%- Essays

10%-Benchmark Exam

Each unit will consist of 1 test grade, a notebook check that assesses classwork and at least 1 project assignment.

3. GEORGIA MILESTONE-The Georgia Milestone test for US History has been suspended for the 20-21 school year. A final exam will be administered in May as a replacement.

5. COURSE OUTLINE:

This course is based around the Georgia "Standards of Excellence" found at:htps://www.georgiastandards.org. There are 23 standards and we are dividing them into four base units (one per quarter). Each base unit will be further divided into testing units, 13 in total. These units are

6. MAKE UP WORK- as stated on page 38 of the Parent Student Handbook, all work must be made up within five days upon return to school. If a student is absent on a test day, the test must be made up before or after school. A daily log of classroom activities will be posted on google classroom so students can make up their work quickly and easily.

7. CLASSROOM EXPECTATIONS:

- 1. You will show respect to everyone in the classroom. When one person is talking everyone is listening. You will not make any rude and unkind comments to other students.
- 2. You are here to learn and so it is imperative that you pay attention. Your focus should be on our and not anything else.
- 3. You will have a pen, chromebook, textbook, and notebook every day that we meet.
- 4. You will be in your seat, sitting quietly and ready to begin when the tardy bell rings. You will remain in your seat unless you have permission to leave it.
- 5. You must read the text, assignments must be completed, and you must prepare properly for examinations.
- 7. If you have questions, concerns, or need extra help, you understand that I am here to help and will be happy to meet with you to discuss any of these.

8. CLASS PROCEDURES:

- 1) Bellringer questions must be written and answered daily. They will be graded every unit
- 2) You will receive 5 bathroom passes at the start of each quarter. Any additional passes will be in exchange for serving detention.
- 3) Each tardy will result in detention, after 5 tardies a discipline referral will be made.
- 4) 5 pts per day will be taken off for late work starting the second day, late work will only be accepted for 5 days after the due date.
- 5) Cell phones will either be packed away or in the classroom charging station.

Students will abide by the policies of Thomas County Schools and Thomas County Central High School policies for tardiness, attendance, make-up work, and discipline. These policie s will be strictly enforced.
