

PSAT INFORMATION

2022 PSAT Date: October 12th, 2022

PSAT is an indicator or performance on SAT and AP readiness; it provides students with a chance to check in on progress toward college and career readiness and success. It is the only way for juniors to qualify for National Merit Scholarship! As a reminder, the PSAT is for ALL 10th grade students as well as any 9th or 11th grade students who register and pay to take the exam (prior to September 9th).

All 10th grade students will take the test and receive a score report at no charge.

Who: ALL 10th grade and 9th & 11th who registered/paid by 9/9/22 ONLY

Where: 2022 PSAT Rooms: Locations will be sent out before test day

When: Wednesday, October 12, 2022 – Students testing should promptly report to their

testing room by 9:20am.

What to Bring:

- #2 Pencil (Yes, your own!)
- Calculator (Yes, your own!). CollegeBoard calculator policy https://satsuite.collegeboard.org/psat-nmsqt/taking-the-test/what-to-bring-leave/calculator-policy
- Snack/Water bottle
- Important Personal Information (In your brain)-
 - Email address (creates your online score account should be an email that the student checks on a regular basis)
 - Home address
 - Past course history
 - College plans/ideas/parents educational background etc.



All students will receive their PSAT/NMSQT scores via their CollegeBoard account in December. Students will provide their email to CollegeBoard on test day via the bubble sheet. When the PSAT/NMSQT scores are uploaded online, students will get an email with instructions on creating a CollegeBoard account, going to the online score report, and using an access code to view scores. https://satsuite.collegeboard.org/psat-nmsqt/scores

Any PSAT testing accommodations must be requested through College Board. The date to submit accommodations requests to CollegeBoard for test day accommodations was August 23rd.
