- Be prepared to write a 4 paragraph essay on an artwork that we have studied based on <u>Feldman's</u> Theory of Art Criticism.
 - <u>Description:</u> Make a list of the visual qualities of the work that are obvious and immediately perceived. Include content and subject matter; "What do you see in the artwork?"
 - <u>Analysis:</u> Focus on the formal aspects of Elements of Art and Principles of Art <u>and</u> how they are used.
 - <u>Interpretation:</u> Propose ideas for possible meaning based on evidence. "What do you think it means?" "What was the artist trying to communicate?" "What clues do you see that support your ideas?"
 - Judgment: Discuss the overall strengths/success/merit of the work and WHY!
