Millennium Middle School will:

2. Hold parent-teacher conferences (at least annually in middle schools) during which this compact will be discussed as it relates to the individual child's achievement. Specifically, those conferences will be held:

Individual conferences can be scheduled throughout the school year on Mondays or Fridays mornings. Conferences are held 8:45 a.m. to 9:15 a.m.

Provide parents with frequent reports on their children's progress. Specifically, the school will provide reports as follows:

Progress Reports (at the 5 week mark of every grading period) and Report Cards (at the end of each 9 week period). Parent conferences available as necessary. Family access through **Skyward** gives real time data on student grades, attendance, and academic history while allowing direct communication with teachers.
