Dear Leilehua Families,

As the third quarter comes to a close, we want to wish everyone a safe and relaxing spring break. As a reminder, there is no school from March 14, 2022, to March 18, 2022. Students return to school on Monday, March 21, 2022, and is followed by Prince Kuhio Day (holiday) on Friday, March 25, 2022.

This year, American College Test (ACT) day is on March 29, 2022. This is a day reserved for the administering of the ACT. We will be inviting only Juniors to campus to participate in testing. In an attempt to create the optimal testing environment, all other grade levels will not have in-person schooling but will have asynchronous lessons from their teachers. The scores from this test can be used for college application purposes, and the best part, it's free. Signing up for the ACT on your own could cost anywhere from about \$40-\$120, and you may have to commute to another location. Remind your child(ren) to get a lot of rest the night before and have something to eat before coming to school. The ACT has stringent guidelines and timelines, so it is critical students are on time, or they may not be allowed to take the test.

Seniors and Juniors wanting to participate in the Graduation Ceremony, please remember the HDOE Commencement Agreement will be enforced during the fourth quarter. Please review the guidelines as we will not be able to stray from them or make adjustments. The criteria are what all students statewide must follow, not just Leilehua students. Make good choices and keep yourselves in good academic standing. We are almost at the end of the year, hang in there and finish the year strong.

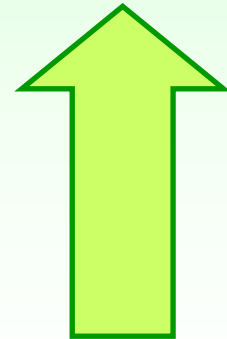

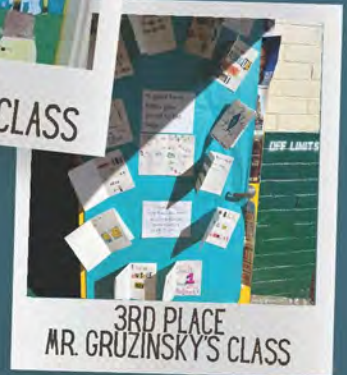

As our Leilehua-Mililani-Waialua Complex Area embraces Computer Science (CS), we will share information to deepen everyone's understanding of CS and show its application in all aspects of life. Our newsletters will cover CS topics and provide resources for families to explore.

WHAT IS COMPUTER SCIENCE?

As the foundation for all computing, computer science is "the study of computers and algorithmic processes, including their principles, their hardware and software designs, their applications, and their impact on society" (Tucker et. al, 2006, p. 2).

Computer science builds on **computer literacy, educational technology, digital citizenship, and information technology** as noted in the K-12 Computer Science Framework.

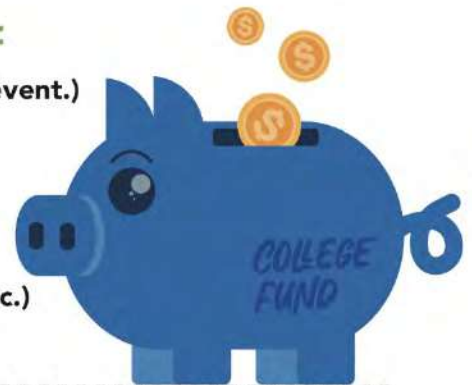

Leilehua High School Class of 1966 Scholarship Application

ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

1. Student will:
 - a. Graduate at the end of this school year;
 - b. Further his/her education beyond high school.
2. Student has demonstrated:
 - a. Reasonable academic record: grade point average 2.5 and higher;
 - b. Civic record i.e., school and/or community service;
 - c. Financial need to further his/her education.
3. Four (4) letters of recommendations or the attached Evaluation Forms are submitted.
4. Completed application form (Parts I and II) and required documents (see above #3) are submitted by due date.

SCHOLARSHIP AMOUNT

1. \$500.00 per student
2. Two (2) eligible students will be awarded.
3. Monetary amount will be paid directly to the student after receipt of written evidence of registration - i.e., payment receipts for tuition, housing, books, and/or documentation of financial aid statement - from the college or academic organization student will attend.

DEADLINE

1. Application form and required documents must be in on or before due date.
2. **Due date: Tuesday, March 1, 2022, by 3:00 p.m. in HH101.**
3. Submit completed application and required documents to College and Career Counselor.

SELECTION PROCESS

1. The Scholarship Committee of the Leilehua High School Class of 1966 will participate in the selection process.
2. All **completed** applications and **required** documents will be reviewed.
3. Selected students will be notified in writing by the Scholarship Committee between one or two weeks after due date.

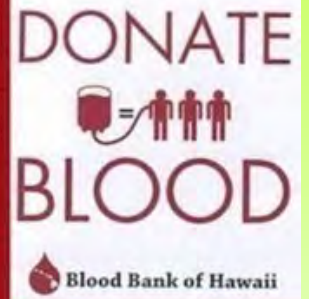

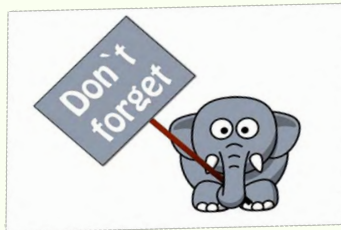
