GUIDELINES FOR A SAFE COMMENCEMENT CEREMONY

Parents and Guests,

Leilehua High School is committed to providing a safe and secure environment for our Commencement Exercises. Given the unfortunate incidents of the recent past, we must all be very diligent about safety and not assume the volatile situations cannot happen here in Hawaii. We ask for your full cooperation to insure that we all enjoy the kind of Commencement Exercise that characterizes our Leilehua Spirit and Pride.

Please be advised that the following rules will be enforced:

- NO alcoholic beverages. Leis made of alcoholic beverages will NOT be permitted into the stadium. Please be reminded that individuals in possession of open containers of alcohol are subject to arrest.
- 2. NO coolers and/or large bags will be permitted into the stadium.
- All spectators must stay outside the fenced area of the field until after the graduates have completed the Commencement Recessional. Gates to field will be opened when graduates reach to their Alpha stations.
- In the event of an emergency, police and security personnel will direct guests out of the stadium.
- 5. In the event of an electrical power outage, or extreme weather event, the Commencement Exercises may be canceled or moved to a different location. An announcement to that effect will be made with a bullhorn.
- 6. Our seniors have been advised that should a graduate pose a safety hazard, the Commencement Exercises will be canceled. An announcement to that effect will be made and all guests will be asked to fully cooperate with our directives to insure a safe graduation ceremony setting.
- Seniors who demonstrate inappropriate behavior will be escorted off the field and forfeit participation in the Commencement Exercises.
- 8. All graduates and guests are requested to exit the stadium by 8:45 PM.

Class of 2016 Graduation Ceremony Information

Graduation services for the Leilehua Class of 2016 will be held at Hugh Yoshida Stadium on school campus. For the safety of those in attendance, we are requesting that stilettos or any footwear with pointed heels not be worn on the field. In order to maintain the field's playing surface, no food or gum chewing will be allowed on the field during and after the commencement ceremony. **Alcohol, coolers, and air horns are not allowed on school grounds or in the stadium.**

Handicap Parking





HAWAII HIGH SCHOOL AUTO ACADEMY





The Hawai' i High School Auto Academy targets high school students interested in the automotive industry in which they participate in an unpaid internship at a Cutter dealership in the mornings, then attend classes at Honolulu CC in the afternoon, five days a week for six weeks to total 120 classroom hours. Summer Engineering Academy

Summer Engineering Academy, or SEA, is an intensive summer program that offers the student the opportunity to learn, to think, and problem-solve like an engineer. <u>Students will apply their knowledge of math and science to practical projects, and see concepts they learned in high school classrooms come alive.</u> Through lab work, group projects, lectures and assignments, you'll learn how engineers approach real-world problems. The students will meet other students with similar interests and collaborate on testing theories and find solutions to engineering problems.

We are currently planning to explore the engineering fields related to micro-robotics,microprocessor programing, and 3-D printing. All these engineering disciplines just so that we can create micro-robots that will be competing with others for a robotics competition. You will have to design, build and program a microbot that is 1 cubic centimeter, and a 1 cubic inch maze solving robot.

Mechanical Engineering, Electrical Engineering, Product Engineering, Mechatronics, are the primary engineering fields that will be explored. Ever wonder how they made that thing move, or how they fit everything into that small a body? That is what engineering is all about. Engineers make things work and fit where they need to go.

As students complete SEA projects on materials, structures, chemical processes, circuit design, computer programming, robotics, and other topics, they will gain insights into which engineering fields best match their abilities and interests. These modules will be two weeks in length and 4 hours long each day. Students will rotate through each module.

Students will also take a college success class to prepare them for entry into the University

System. This class is designed to orient students to the college setting. Students will be able to identify campus resources, demonstrate knowledge of

c olle g e procedures, discuss definition of success and evaluate their important life roles. Students will attend this course during the 3rd week of the program.

<u>Prerequisites are completion of geometry, completion of physics, or chemistry or biology and basic</u> <u>computer skills.</u>





Imagine you are Matt Damon in "The Martian," trapped on Mars with no way home -or a member of Apollo 13, scrambling to save your crew with only the scant materials on board the ship. These are the kinds of almost-impossible tasks engineers have to deal with every day. Through this course, you will learn how to tackle that kind of problem solving, as well as the basics of Electrical Engineering, Mechanical Engineering, Computer Programming, including electronics, prototyping, writing code and more as you explore what makes the world around you move and function.
