GUIDELINES FOR A SAFE COMMENCEMENT CEREMONY

Parents and Guests,

Leilehua High School is committed to providing a safe and secure environment for our Commencement Exercises. We ask for your full cooperation to ensure that we all enjoy the kind of commencement Exercise that characterizes our Leilehua spirit and pride.

Please be advised that the following rules will be enforced:

1. NO alcoholic beverages. Leis made of alcoholic beverages will NOT be permitted into the stadium. Please be reminded that individuals in possession of open containers of alcohol are subject to arrest.
2. No coolers and/or large bags will be permitted into the stadium.
3. All spectators must stay outside the fenced area of the field until after the graduates have completed the Commencement Recessional. Gates to the field will be opened when the graduates reach to their Alpha stations.
4. In the event of an emergency, police and security personnel will direct guests out of the stadium.
5. In the event of an electrical power outage, or extreme weather event, the Commencement Exercises may be canceled or moved to a different location. An announcement to that effect will be made with a bullhorn.
6. Our seniors have been advised that should a graduate pose a safety hazard, the Commencement Exercises will be cancelled. An announcement to that effect will be made and all guests will be asked to fully cooperate with our directives to insure a safe graduation ceremony setting.
7. Seniors who demonstrate inappropriate behavior will be escorted off the field and forfeit participation in the Commencement Exercises.
8. All graduates and guest are requested to exit the stadium by 8:45 p.m.

Graduation services for the Leilehua Class of 2017 will be held at Hugh Yoshida Stadium on the school campus. For the safety of those in attendance, we are requesting that stilettos or any footwear with pointed heels not be worn on the field. In order to maintain the field's playing surface, no food or gum chewing will be allowed on the field after the commencement ceremony. Alcohol, coolers, and air horns are not allowed in the stadium.

Quick Answers

✓ How do I add money/make a payment to my child's account?

You can continue to send money to school with your student or you can add money through SchoolCafé. Follow the steps in Make a Payment in this guide.

✓ I made an online payment. When can my student use the payment?

Your student's cafeteria account at the school is credited within 24 hours but may become available as quickly as 2 hours.

✓ Is there a fee or service charge for making online payments?

A convenience fee **may be** charged for each online payment transaction. For example, if you make a \$20.00 payment and the convenience fee is \$1.00, the total debited from your credit card is \$21.00. The available funds for your child will be \$20.00. Convenience fee amounts vary by school district.

✓ Can I receive notification when my student's account balance is low?

Yes! Follow the steps in Set Up a Low Balance Alert in this guide.

✓ Why was my account locked when making a payment?

After three failed payment attempts, payment function is locked. Contact SchoolCafé to remove the lock.

✓ What if I have several students in different schools?

Include as many students as you need in your account. The students can attend any school within the same district. Payments for each student are made separately.

✓ Can I transfer money from one child to another?

Contact the Child Nutrition Services office at the school district for assistance with a transfer.

✓ What happens to the money in my account at the end of the school year?

Your account balance moves with your student(s) from grade to grade and school to school within the district. Contact the Child Nutrition Services office at the school district for assistance with a refund.

✓ How do I receive a refund if my child changes school districts?

Contact the Child Nutrition Services office at the school district for assistance with a refund.

After advancing through two phases of online competition, the Leilehua High "Mighty Mules" JROTC Leadership Team and the Waimea High Menehune Battalion will compete at the 2017 Army JROTC Leadership & Academic Bowl (JLAB) in Washington DC. The competition will be held from June 22-27, 2017, and is sponsored by the Army JROTC and conducted by the College Options Foundation.

Forty Army JROTC Leadership Bowl teams in the nation have advanced to JLAB, which includes an all-expense paid trip to the Championship event in DC. During the two fast-paced preliminary rounds, cadets were tested on their knowledge of current events, leadership values and leadership skills.

The Leilehua High JROTC team earned top scores out of the 1,378 Army JROTC teams that competed from around the world. It is composed of Cadet Faith Boyce-Jennings, Cadet Morgan Burks, Cadet Kobee Ledward, Cadet Janarah Jones, and team alternate Cadet Essence Johnson. The team's coach and chaperone is Nick Spiridigliozi, Lieutenant Colonel U.S. Army Retired.

JLAB is a nationally recognized competition created exclusively for JROTC students. By participating, cadets learn the values of citizenship, academic competition, and college opportunity. The competition creates tremendous opportunities for JROTC cadets by allowing them to demonstrate leadership and academic abilities.

Bus Passes



BUS PASS POLICIES

- All bus riders must be prepared to display a valid bus pass or bus coupon to the bus driver upon demand. If the student lost or misplaced the pass, the bus driver is expected to check the rider manifest to confirm the student's eligibility status:
 - Middle school and elementary school students who fail or refuse to display a valid bus pass in the mornings will be transported to school. However, they will be expected to obtain a temporary bus pass from the school office before their next ride;
 - High school students who fail or refuse to display a valid bus pass in the mornings could be refused a ride to school if their name is not on the rider manifest;
 - All grade levels of students who fail or refuse to display a valid bus pass in the afternoons may be required to obtain a replacement temporary bus pass from the school if their name is not on the rider manifest;
 - All grade levels of students who fail or refuse to display a valid bus pass upon demand will be reported to the school principal.
- Attempting to board a school bus without a valid bus pass is a violation of the DOE Passenger Safety Code (reference Title 8, Chapter 28) and is therefore subject to school discipline.
- All bus passes and coupons are non-transferable. Any student who shares or attempts to share a bus pass or coupon with another student will be reported to the school principal.
- For fare paying riders, there is a \$5 fee to replace a lost or stolen bus pass card.
- Bus drivers are required to confiscate expired, altered and/or defaced bus passes, and report all incidents involving the attempted use of an expired, altered and/or defaced bus pass to the school principal.

Payment Plans

All bus riders (except those who are approved for free bus service) must pay the prevailing transportation fee. We offer three payment-plan options:

1. **Annual Payment Plan** – one-time discounted payment of \$270 roundtrip or \$135 one-way
2. **Quarterly Payment Plan** – up to 4 discounted easy payments of \$72.00 roundtrip or \$36.00 one-way
3. **One-Way Bus Coupons** – sold in sheets of ten coupons for \$12.50 per sheet (cash only)

- Students who intend to use the public school bus system as their primary means of getting to and/or from school daily throughout the entire school year are encouraged to select the **ANNUAL** payment plan.
- Students who intend to use the public school bus system as their primary means of getting to and/or from school daily but whose transportation needs might change from academic quarter to academic quarter are encouraged to select the **QUARTERLY** payment plan.
- Students who intend to use the public school bus system only occasionally, and students who require passage on a bus route other than their assigned bus route are encouraged to purchase **One-way Bus Coupons** to mitigate the financial burden.

Please read.....

OFF-CAMPUS PASS / EARLY RELEASE

Any request to leave campus must be made in writing and submitted to the school office before the school day begins. Requests by a parent/legal guardian must include the following information: *student's legal name, *home telephone number, *phone number where the parent/guardian can be reached, *date/time for release, reason for release, *time student will return to school (if applicable). IF NO REQUEST IS MADE BEFORE SCHOOL BEGINS, AUTHORIZED PARENT OR LEGAL GUARDIAN MUST BE PRESENT FOR RELEASE. The student is responsible for presenting his/her off-campus pass to his/her teachers on the following school day. Students found off campus without a valid off-campus pass are subject to arrest for truancy.

Senior Recognition

Seniors: Reminder: College acceptance letters, scholarship offers and military commitment papers must be submitted to the College & Career Center in HH101 by 5/12/17 for recognition in the graduation program. We can't celebrate your accomplishments if we don't know about them so please share with us. We can also provide you with assistance in completing your requirements for college enrollment, FAFSA help, military enlistment, or preparing for job interviews. We are open from 8:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. daily.

Seniors: Final Transcript Requests

Seniors: All seniors attending college need to submit one (1) Final Transcript Request form to the Registrar's Office for Leilehua High School to mail your final transcript to the college you plan to enroll in the Fall 2017. If you need to confirm your eligibility for collegiate sports through NCAA or NAIA, then you must also submit a Final Transcript Request form for Leilehua High School to mail your transcript. The cost is \$2.00 per transcript. Final Transcript Requests will be processed in early June and will include all final grades and proof of your graduation. Final Transcript Request Forms are available in the College & Career Center and the Registrar's Office.

Planning for Post High Using Naviance

All Leilehua High School students have a Naviance.com account on which they do college and career exploration and research and build a resume. 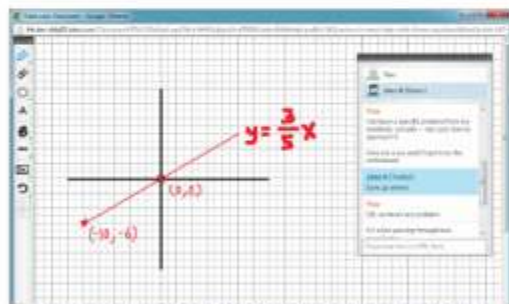
