Academics & Behavior:

Tiers of Intervention are in place for all students. At risk students not meeting academic proficiency and/or struggling behaviorally will be considered for RTI Tier 1, 2 and 3 interventions.

Meets weekly to discuss and review schoolwide systems at MVES.

Leadership:

Meets monthly to progress monitor our academic plan, schoolwide systems. Every grade level is represented at Leadership.

Curriculum & Learning

MVES focuses on developing the whole child: academically, behaviorally and the physical and social emotional well being of all haumana.

To address Common Core State Standards (CCSS), research based curriculum utilized at MVES include Reading Wonders, Stepping Stones, Second Steps and MindUP. Enhanced Core Reading Instruction (ECRI), in grades K-2 to teach the foundational skills of reading. Grades 3-5 use Flipbooks to explicitly teach vocabulary and the spelling-focused phonics components.

Schoolwide Positive Behavior Interventions and Support (PBIS) helps to create a positive school culture.

i-Ready is used as the school's universal screener for ELA and Math and used to monitor students academic progress throughout the year. In addition to the core curriculum, students participate in Culture Based Education, Physical Education, Art and Gardening, and Social Emotional Learning (SEL) through Mind Up classes.

Kamehameha Schools Kealapono teach Science alongside our teachers in grades 3-5 focused around Next Generation Science Standards.
