For 8th grade:

One of the major concepts 8th graders study – both in Math 8 and in Algebra – is the idea of linearity. What makes a situation linear? How can we tell how two linear situations are related? Here is an activity you can do with your 8th grader: Playing Catch-Up (also available at student.desmos.com with code ST5SZS). Can you predict whether one racer will catch another? This task works on tablets or laptops but not on cell phones.

For 7th grade:

One of the major concepts 7th graders study is how to represent situations using variable expressions. Here is an activity you can do with your 7th grader: Pool Border Problem (also available at student.desmos.com with code Q3BDQY). Can you find a general way to think about how many tiles are needed for the pool border? This task works on tablets or laptops but not on cell phones.
