Aloha Kalama families,

The information about our **Renaissance program** was not widely distributed earlier this year. I apologize for any disappointment this may have caused some of our students and their families. The Renaissance program information can be found here, on our school website.

Due to the lack of promotion, I made changes to compensate for the impact this may have had on our students and their families.

The deadline for first quarter community service hours was moved, more than once, as students and families made inquiries

The requirement of making Renaissance for three quarters to be eligible for the end of year banquet has been temporarily changed to two quarters. It will return to the original requirement of three quarters, starting next school year.

Communication regarding the presence of the Renaissance program will increase, through the parent e-newsletter and student media broadcast.

Enrollment: Online or Paper

Enrollment must be done every year. Enrollment requires a parent/guardian signature. It can be done online (school website) or on paper (copies found in the school library). Once enrolled, students will receive an automated "Welcome" email with more program information. If enrolling online, if the email isn't easily seen, students can search their mail for "Renaissance". If enrolling on paper, students should allow 2-3 days before searching, to allow time for manual data entry.

Community Service change

Community service will not require a parent/guardian signature. It will be an honor system. I may still check to validate reported service hours. The online form will ask for community service contact information. Community service can ONLY be done ONLINE and should only be done by students, using their school provided Gmail.

Requiring independent reporting is one of the character traits of a Renaissance and Kalama student, as being a self-directed learner (GLO 1, KA 1) is one of Kalama's learning outcomes. Ideally, Renaissance students in particular should strive to submit their volunteer hours, with its details, by a deadline.

Instructions for online reporting are (1) sent in an automated email upon enrollment, (2) explained on our school website, and (3) in the Google Classroom for Renaissance. Links to submit their service online are on our school website, and in the Google Classroom for Renaissance students. Students receive the join code for the Renaissance Classroom in their emails, once enrollment is complete.
