ATTENDANCE POLICY

TARDIES

- 1. Students must report to class by 7:50 a.m. daily.
- 2. Students arriving after 8:00 am, should report directly to the office for an admittance pass.
- 3. Student must report to class by the start time noted on the bell schedule, otherwise they will be considered tardy. Tardy sweeps may be conducted to remind students of the importance of being prompt. Students may be assigned detention for tardies.

ABSENCES

According to Department of Education (DOE) policy, students are considered absent if they are not in school for more than 1/2 of the school day. School ends at 2:00 on Mon, Tues, Thur, Fri and at 1:10 on Wed. Students will be marked ABSENT for the day if they report to school after 11:00.

1. Students are considered absent if they are not physically present in a scheduled class for at least half of the class period.

REMINDER

For the safety of the students, a photo ID is needed when picking up a student from school.

The person picking up the student must be listed on the student's Emergency Card.

LUNCH PROGRAM

Lost, damaged, or stolen lunch cards must be replaced. First replacement is free.

Payments must be cash only. Students must have their lunch card with money in their account to be served lunch. Students must have an ID for lunch. Students without ID's may still eat lunch, but may be assigned detention.

- No student shall be denied lunch solely for failure to pay
- After the first 21 days, students can charge up to seven breakfasts and seven lunches (negative balance)
- School will communicate with families regarding low or negative balances and assist with free and reduced lunch meal applications
