- All players who rush the quarterback must be 10 yards from the line of scrimmage when the ball is snapped.



The Land Meets The Sea NALU Studies 101 ridge to reef course

Find out how much fun science and biology are through this amazing two-week program. Be the scientist and conduct water quality testing in fresh water and marine environments. Go to the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Services reserve and snorkel Hanalei Bay to identify and classify marine organisms. Explore the valleys and streams on Oahu to study native and invasive plant and animal species. Depart on a plankton tow mission to look for new marine species and use biotechnology to extract DNA from marine bacteria and more.



Exploring Our Oceans NALU Studies 102 pre-requisite NALU 101 marine science course

An in-depth, two-week course exploring areas of oceanography including plankton, ocean currents, and navigation using the stars. Snorkel coral reefs as a marine biologist and study reef ecology and the living organisms that inhabit them at Coconut Island and other locations. Become a molecular biologist and extract real DNA from marine bacteria to assess coral reef health. Explore the lives of whales, dolphins, and sharks and their roles in the environment and Hawaiian culture.
