Kyle Quilausing is living proof of the power of your choices.

Born in Hilo, Hawaii, Kyle's upbringing was ideal. He describes being brought up by his grandfather with wholesome family values and strong morals and ethics. After his grandfather introduced him to



golf at the age of 5, Kyle quickly fell in love with the sport, dedicating every waking moment to perfecting his craft and becoming a six-time state golf champion, winning 16 titles, coming 4th in the world, and playing alongside Tiger Woods at ten years old. But after allowing his relative success to make him arrogant and prideful, Kyle was expelled from high school in his senior year, which became the catalyst for a downward spiral that eventually led him to become a 98-pound crystal meth addict, labeled Hawaii's most wanted and a menace to society.

UNIFORM POLICY

Kalama Intermediate School has chosen to adopt a School Uniform Policy. Students attending Kalama Intermediate are required to wear the uniform Monday - Friday.

Students must adhere to the following:

- Uniform must be on as soon as the student steps onto the campus grounds.
- Jacket, sweater, pullover, or flannel shirt are acceptable over the uniform.

Outerwear needs to be appropriate, following dress code guidelines.

- Uniforms should not be altered.
- Uniform top can be any shirt representing an official Kalama class, club or sport. PE shirts can be used as a uniform top.
- Footwear is mandatory.

Students need to adhere to the school's uniform policy by wearing it daily and ensuring it is worn properly. Please note that uniforms are not to be used as scarves. Additionally, uniforms should be worn as the outermost garment unless a jacket or sweatshirt is worn over it.

Optional Dress Days

Subject to the Kalama Dress Code, students will be allowed to wear regular attire (with specific guidelines) on the following days:

- Picture day
- Halloween appropriate costume permitted
- Spirit Week Daily Spirit Week attire
- 8th grade Banquet Grade 8 only
- And other days as designated by Administration and Student Government

Dress Code Guidelines (for Free Dress Days and Uniform Waiver Students)
Tops:

- No drug/alcohol/gang/sexual references
- No demeaning slogans or pictures
- No tank tops, halter tops or spaghetti straps
- No exposed bras, bare backs, or stomachs

Bottoms:

- No visible underwear
- Appropriate fit

Possible Consequences for Violation of the Dress Code and/or Uniform Policy Students will:

- Be given a uniform loaner which needs to be returned at the end of the school day.
- Parent notified of the non-compliance.
- Be subject to having the item confiscated and returned at a later time.
- Be subject to other disciplinary measures such as detention.

Bus applications <u>must be submitted on a QUARTERLY</u> basis and will not be accepted outside of the indicated periods listed, please plan accordingly. NO ANNUAL PASSES.

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS
