Weekly Skills

Language Arts

We will continue writing our names (first and last) as well as forming uppercase and lowercase letters.

We will continue recognizing uppercase and lowercase letters and their sounds.

Math

We will build numbers to 20 with ten frames, counting objects to 20 in a scattered formation and up to 20 in an organized formation, number word recognition, and write numbers 0-20 to represent number of objects.

Science

We will begin to describe objects in terms of the materials they are made of (alike and difference) and their physical properties.

Social Studies

We will begin learning about Maps & Globes.
