Kindergarten News

Welcome to the start of our 2022-2023 school year! Kindergarten scholars are busy as we learn about our school and classroom family. The first six weeks of school we focus on learning All About Me. During this time, we learn about ourselves, our emotions and relationships. We will investigate the five senses and learn how we can observe and learn about our world.

The Primary Program of International Baccalaureate identified learner attributes that develop global citizens who work together to make our planet a peaceful and better place to live. During our unit of inquiry, we will focus on three learner profiles, and we ask you to encourage our scholars to show these traits daily.

- 1. Caring: We can show empathy and compassion for others and our planet. At home activities: Model caring behavior such as helping others, smiling and using kind words. How can you care for our community?
- 2. Communicator: We can express ourselves and our ideas creatively and with confidence. At home activities: Encourage your child to be a good listener and to share about their day. Ask open ended questions such as, "What was your favorite part of the day? Did anything funny happen at school? What surprised you today? What did you play with your friends? What was the story that you listened to today? Who or what was the book about? Have your child call, write a letter or email a family member to share about school or simply say hello!
- 3. Principled: We understand the importance of rules, honesty and fairness and will stand up for what is right. At home activities: Play games that have rules, point out rules that adults follow such as stopping at a red light and talk about rules that you have at home.

Please remember to have your child wear their nametag daily and learn their lunch number. Check the take home folder for important information. If you have not returned the beginning of the year paperwork, please do so as soon as possible.

1st Grade News

Hello from First Grade!

We are so excited for this year, and we are all so happy to be your child's teachers! The first couple weeks we focus on getting to know one another and building a strong classroom community. Our other main goal is to strengthen our reading and writing skills and excel in our addition and subtraction facts.

Please stay tuned with lots of information of what is to come!

In Reading, our students will be learning how to retell stories in sequence and identifying the beginning, middle and end. They will also identify the characters and settings of stories we read. These are skills that you can use when reading with your child at home! We love our meaningful stories about treating others how you want to be treated, sharing, and being part of a community.

In Science, our kiddos are beginning to learn certain tools and skills it takes to be a real-life scientist. Stay tuned for experiments to come to life as well.

In Math, our scholars have been reviewing math facts 0 to 10. They have been learning different strategies to find the sum or differences in math facts. Some of the strategies include- using a number line, using counters, and drawing a picture to solve math problems.

2nd Grade News

Greetings 2022 – 2023 Second Graders!

We hope you all had a fun, exciting, and well rested summer vacation. It is time for students to rev their engines and get ready for an adventurous experience as a Second Grader!

In ELA (reading, writing, and language arts), Unit 1 we will be exploring "Family and Friends." The Big Idea question being, "How do families and friends learn, grow, and help one another?" Students will learn to identify main story elements, such as, character, setting, and events. In Math, students will be able to use strategies to achieve automaticity with addition and subtraction within 20. In Science, students will learn about the scientific process for conducting investigations, the difference between inferences and observations, using observations to create explanations and the importance of repeating investigations. In Social Studies, students will investigate, discuss, explain the consequence of an absence of rules and services. "What Happens When There Are No Rules?"

Parents, please make sure you are checking your student's planner on a daily basis. Your student's planner is a great way for parents and teachers to communicate. Friday, August 19, 2022, the 1st homework assignments will go home as a packet. Homework packets will be turned in on Fridays and new ones will be given for the next week. Friday to Friday. Any questions or concerns, please contact your student's teacher.

Second Grade Teachers

3rd Grade News

Welcome back to our new third graders and their families! We are so excited for this year! This month, we have been busy getting back into the routine of school and learning about our classroom family.

We have started diving deep into our third grade IB curriculum. The first 6 weeks of school we are focusing on our first unit - Who We Are. In reading and social studies, we are learning about different cultures and their contributions to our culture. We will be reading informational texts and focusing on the central idea and key details. One highlight of the unit will be our Culture Showcase. The scholars will get to bring in something that is important to their culture/family and share it with the class. They will also get to view items that other scholars bring in. More information about this will be coming home soon.

In math, we have kicked off our lessons with multiplication! Scholars are learning different strategies to solve multiplication problems such as repeated addition and equal grouping. Third grade is the year we recommend all scholars memorize their multiplication facts. Flashcards are a great way to get started with that.

During our first unit of inquiry, we will focus on four learner attributes, and we ask you to encourage our scholars to show these traits daily.

Communicator: We can express ourselves and our ideas creatively and with confidence

At home activities: *Encourage your child to be a good listener and to share about their day. Ask open ended questions such as, "What was your favorite part of the day?

Knowledgeable: We learn more about ourselves, others, and the world.

At home activities: *Encourage your child to read books at home that correspond with the topics being covered in school. *Ask your child about what they are learning in school and engage them in conversations about it: "Why do you think that is an important thing to know about?"

Open-minded: We listen to other thoughts and ideas and accept that there is more than one way of looking at things.

At home activities: *Encourage your child to try new things – new foods, new games, and new activities. *Expose your child to different festivals, celebrations, and traditions.

Risk-taker: We are willing to make mistakes and learn from them, prepared to try something new and willing to try things in different ways. At home activities: *If your child is feeling uneasy about trying something, encourage them to attempt it and then reflect on both whether they liked the activity and how it felt to try something new.

If you have any questions or concerns, now or throughout the year, please contact your child's teacher through email, your child's planner or by phone. We are looking forward to a great year of learning with each of our scholars!

4th Grade News

Welcome back!!

We are so excited to have all of our 4th graders here ready to learn while having fun. We are beginning the year in the IB PYP unit of How We Organize Ourselves. Did you know?

Dear Wicklow Families,

Did you know that absenteeism during the first month of school can predict poor attendance throughout the school year? Poor attendance can influence whether a child can read proficiently by the end of 3rd grade or be held back. By 6th grade chronic absenteeism is the leading indicator of whether a student will drop out from high school. Below is a list of what constitutes an excused absence. Please be sure to communicate with your students' teachers regarding any and all absences.

What counts as an excused absence:

- O Personal illness of the student with a doctor's note (Any absence in which the student is out 5 or more consecutive days requires medical documentation to be excused.)
- O Court appearance of the student
- O Medical appointment of the student with a doctor's note
- O Approved school activity
- O Extreme weather
- O Other absences with prior approval of the principal or designee
- O Attendance at a center under Children and Families Services supervision
- O Significant community events with prior permission of the principal
- o Religious instruction or religious holiday
- O Death in the immediate family
- O Appointments for a therapy service provided by a licensed health care practitioner
