# Next Week We Will Learn About ...

#### Reading: Socks/Leveled Readers/Poetry/Parts of a Story

-The student will ask and answer questions (who, what, where, when, how) to demonstrate understanding of key details in a text.

-The student will describe the overall structure of a story, including the beginning (introduction), middle, and the end (concludes the action).

-The student will describe how words and phrases supply rhythm and meaning in a story, poem, or song.

-The student will define words using phrases to develop vocabulary.

-The student will read a level K text fluently with sufficient accuracy.

**ELA/Grammar:** Apostrophes with Contractions and Possessive Nouns

-The student will use an apostrophe to form contractions and frequently occurring possessive nouns.

### Writing: Informational Writing

-The student will write informative texts in which they introduce a topic, use facts and definitions to develop points, and provide a concluding statement or section.

-organization (beginning, middle, and end)

-focus (staying on the topic)

-writing process (prewrite, drafting, revising, proofreading, publishing)

-capitalization and punctuation

Math: Finish Addition and Subtraction with Regrouping

-The student will fluently add and subtract within 20 using mental strategies.

- The student will fluently add and subtract within 100 using strategies based on place value, properties of observation and/or the relationship between addition and subtraction.

### Social Studies: Georgia's First People

-The student will describe the Georgia Creek and Cherokee cultures of the past including tools, clothing, homes, ways of making a living, cultural/geographical systems, and accomplishments.

-The student will be able to read about and describe the lives of historical figures in Georgia history and how the figures demonstrate positive character traits.
