Our staff spent over one year preparing a self-study report to identify areas of strength and challenges based on demographic, program, and achievement data points. In April, 2018, the accrediting commission, Western Association of Schools and Colleges (WASC), awarded Hanalei School a six-year term of accreditation with a mid term report- this is one of the highest terms of accreditation possible! Although this is simply stated here, that feedback from an external entity validating the educational programming at Hanalei School was extremely satisfying. That commendation gives Hanalei School a chance to celebrate continual growth and supports our efforts towards excellence every day.
