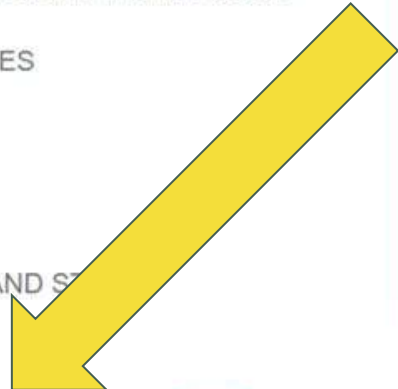

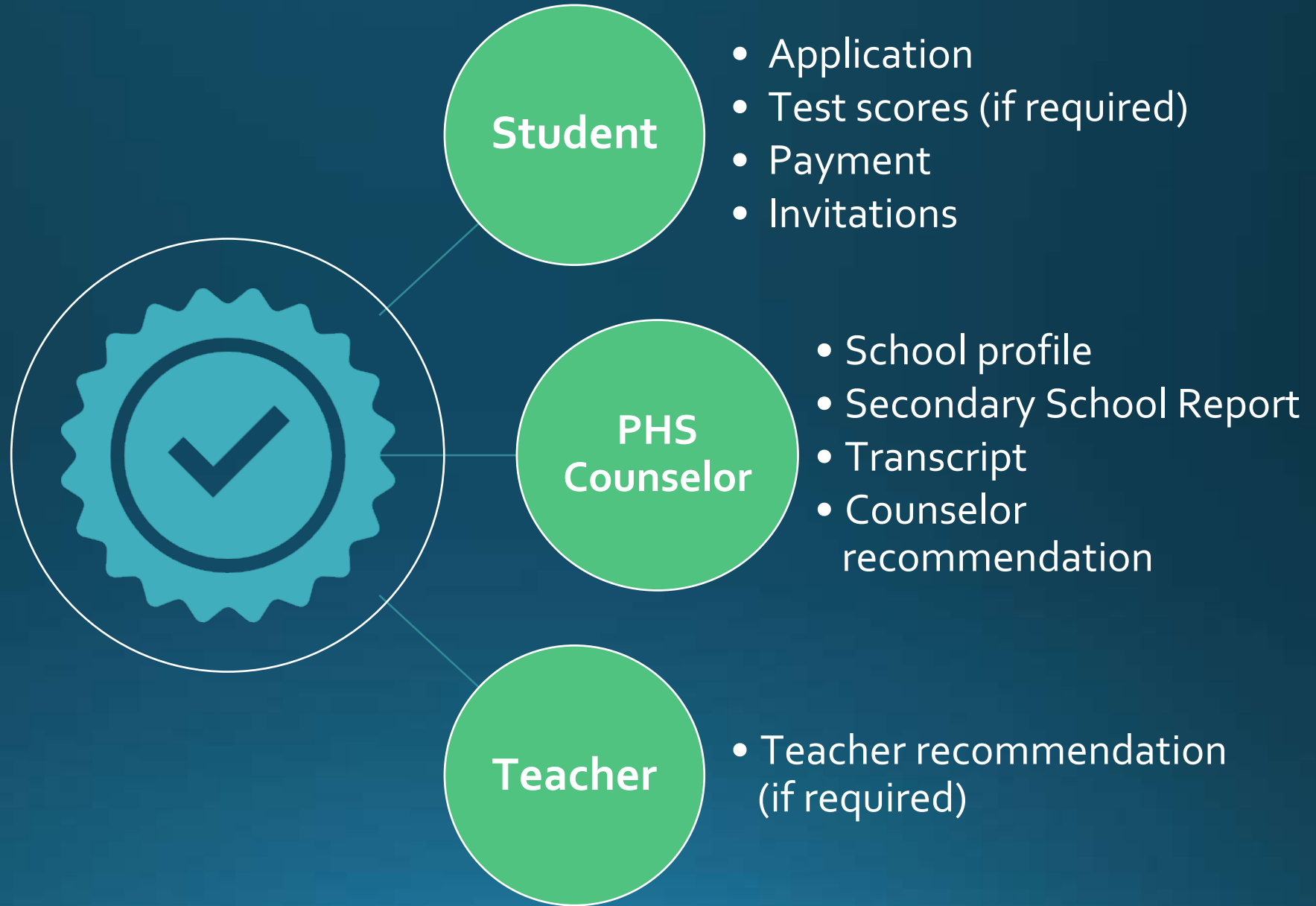

Requesting official New Trier transcripts

- Transcript requests are made via [Google form](#) (CHECK LINK) in Canvas
- A transcript request for each college/scholarship is required, \$5 per college after first 3 (billed in January)
- A submitted request gives NT permission to send the transcript or required documentation
- Students (not parents) must submit forms at least one month before an application deadline to ensure timely submission
- Transcripts' submission status will be documented on Common App account
- Students are responsible for checking the completed status of their application with each college

SCHOOL AND COMMUNITY
New Trier Township High School District 203 is a comprehensive four-year high school in Northfield and Winnetka, Illinois, located along the Lake Michigan shore, approximately 16 miles north of Chicago. New Trier serves Chicago's North Shore suburban communities of Glencoe, Kenilworth, Northfield, Wilmette, Winnetka, and portions of Glenview and Northbrook, communities that reflect a tradition of support for academic and cultural achievement. Freshmen are housed on the Northfield Campus; sophomores, juniors, and seniors are housed on the Winnetka Campus.

Governed by its own Board of Education, the district serves six sender public school districts (kindergarten through eighth grade), each with its own governing board. Local private and parochial schools also graduate students who advance to New Trier High School.

EXTRACURRICULAR OPPORTUNITIES
As evidence of the New Trier motto, "to commit minds to inquiry, hearts to compassion, and lives to the service of humanity," New Trier offers numerous opportunities for learning and involvement outside of the classroom in activities, athletics, fine and performing arts, and social service through:

- More than 150 clubs and other student activities, including an extensive social service component;
- 35 interscholastic sports (winning more athletic state championships than any high school in Illinois interscholastic history) as well as an extensive intramural program; and
- Fine and performing arts programs, including a Grammy-award winning music department.

GUIDANCE
New Trier's nationally recognized student-advisement system provides a small-school atmosphere within a large school of outstanding opportunities. More than 40% of the faculty serve as advisers, meeting with the same group of approximately 25 students every day for 25 minutes. Advisers provide academic and personal guidance to students throughout their high school years. They also serve as the primary contact for parents. In addition, eight post-high school counselors help students plan for higher education and other alternatives after New Trier.

COLLEGE ATTENDANCE RATE
Approximately 97% of New Trier's Class of 2022 enrolled in college. Of the Class of 2022, 93.4% enrolled in four-year bachelor degree programs and 3.6% enrolled in two-year associate degree programs.

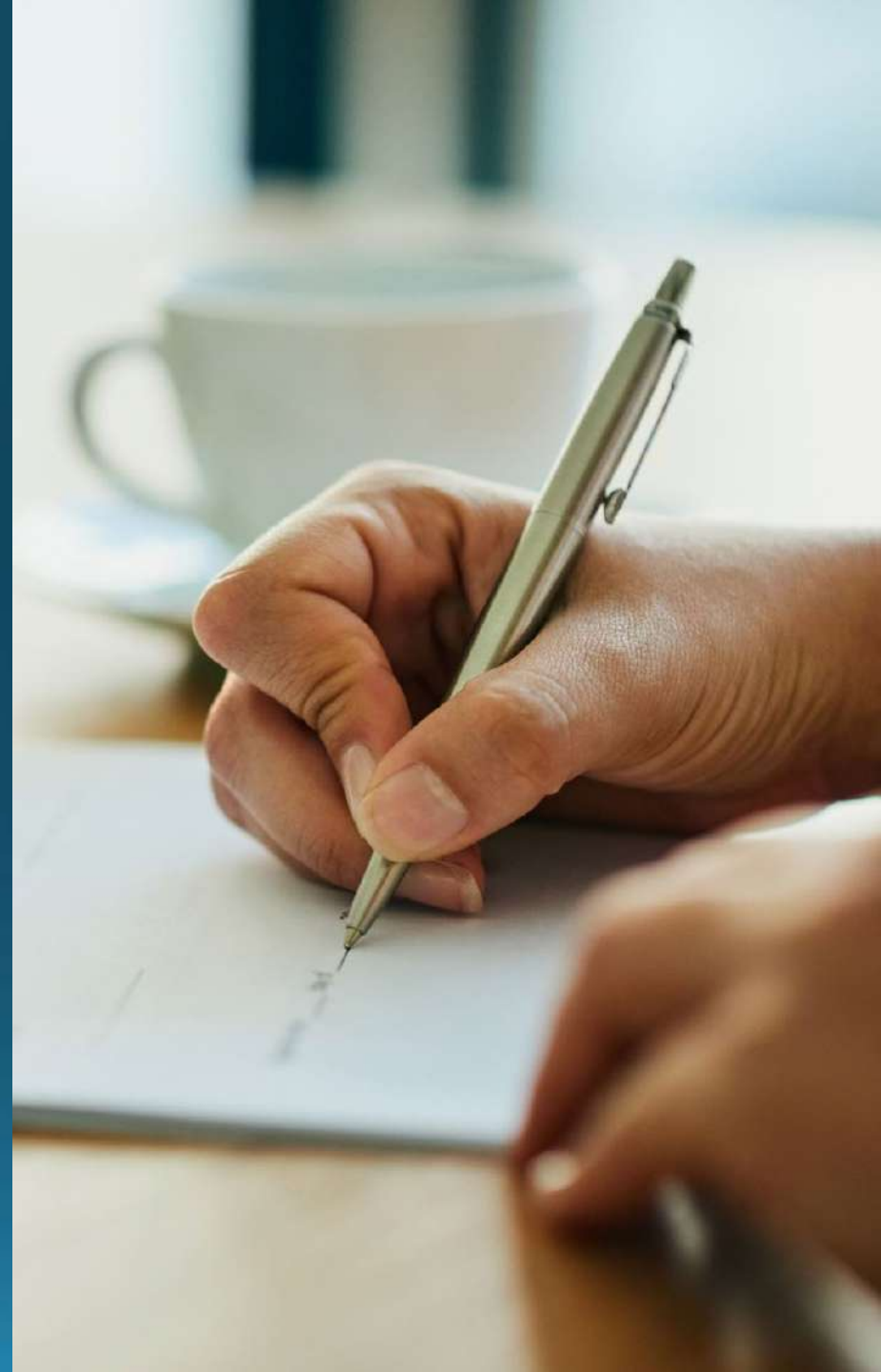

Ethical considerations

- **The student** is responsible for notifying colleges if an academic class was dropped *after* the transcript was submitted
- Compliance with Early Decision or Restrictive Early Action policies
- Student is the sole author of their application
- All information reported (including ESSAYS, self-reported grades and test scores) is truthful and accurate
- May 1st National Candidate Reply Date – a deposit expected to only one institution



A note about quarter grades...

- Quarter grades are *not* reported on the transcript
- Sample list of colleges that have required first quarter grades can be found on PHSC Canvas
 - Class Pages > Seniors > Quarter grades list
- Unofficial progress report



Midyear and Final Transcripts

Midyear/Semester Grades

- Sent *automatically* by PHSC by mid-January

Final Transcripts

- Sent *after* a student notifies us of their final post-high school plans via a Naviance survey distributed in April

How many letters do you need?

Check each school's website for specific requirements or stipulations

Look to see what is *required* vs. *optional*

Do not request letters for colleges that will not accept them (i.e. University of Illinois, University of California)

Requesting teacher letters of rec

Junior year faculty who taught you in a core academic class, not coaches or advisers.

Reach out directly to request a letter of recommendation.

Unless faculty require their own individual form, you should complete the [NTHS Teacher Recommendation Form](#)

Fillable pdf is downloadable via Senior Class page in PHSC Canvas

One month before the application deadline

- Submit the completed form and materials to your recommender.
- Confirm email address BEFORE inviting them to the online platforms.
- Please follow up with a thank-you note
- **Teachers have until the application deadline to submit the letter on your behalf.**



Considerations for students seeking accommodations

Research disability office and level of support:

- Accommodations/Support Office/Full Services Program
- Documentation requirements- varies by institutions (Interview only vs. additional documentation)
- Determine if additional application is needed

Apply to the college before applying for accommodations

Apply for accommodation at the college you plan to attend

Compose statement of self-disclosure
